Key Initiatives

SB 317

New Legislation (effective 1/1/2022)

Repealed prior legislation that allowed restoration as an option for people identified as Misdemeanor Incompetent to Stand Trial (MIST).

Instead, they must be referred to diversion, collaborative justice, or community- based treatment.

The individual must accept the referral, services are provided only to the extent that resources are available, and the defendant is eligible for MH services

SB 317

- DMH is working with courts to identify treatment options and to dedicate resources to meeting needs
- Treatment Options:
 - Outpatient Services
 - Enhanced Residential Services
 - Inpatient Hospitalization/IMD
 - AOT
 - Conservatorship







County Proposed SB317 Process



Notes

- Assumes CHS (for in-custody) or DMH/ODR (for released on own recognizance) will assess for compelled treatment to inform diversion hearing and begin AOT or conservatorship assessment processes, if recommended
- For L2 Crisis Residential:
 - ODR has 20 COVID-19 beds that will be repurposed as an unlocked stabilization spot for SB317 MIST population
 - o Currently assumes average 1 week turnover at this site
 - Is recuperative care an option for those with medical needs but not at level of inpatient?
 - o DMH has crisis residential beds in this LOC
- For L3 Residential Treatment:
 - ODR has 156 interim beds for the MIST population, with expected turnover of 20 beds/month
 - As a backup, DMH is making available ERS inventory, which would be comparable to ODR's beds
- For L4, DMH identified 2 additional FSP teams who could serve an additional 100-120 patients each, while the ATI Office expects to make available 400 beds over the next 2 years through the ATI Incubation Academy
 - Partial Hospitalization Program/Intensive Outpatient Program (PHP/IOP) will be available after July 2022
- Is Housing for Health (HFH) placements an option? DMH could add FSP services, which could increase housing options.
- Decanting: Ongoing assessments to move clients to lower levels of care and to create beds for new MISTs.

General Updates

- Telework Continues (~72% of Department)
- # of clients served and # of visits has been steady over time
- % of in person vs telephone/video appointments increased slightly




Telehealth Distinct Clients Assessments
