B. DMH Updates - Pinki Mehta

- Pinki shared that the Board of Supervisors required all County employees be fully vaccinated by October 2021.
- Rosario reported that the department is still interviewing candidates and has not hired anyone for the Health Promoters position for disabled community (from Dr. Partida's Office).

C. Announcement of the new Co-Chair - Rosario Ribleza

- Rosario announced that Hector Ramirez was voted in as the new Co-Chair for the Access for All subcommittee.
- She thanked Roque Bucton for all his hard work and dedication while serving as Co-Chair for the Access for All subcommittee.

D. Brief Spiels – Hector Ramirez, Roque Bucton and Sunnie Whipple

- Hector Ramirez thanked everyone from Department of Mental Health (DMH) staff to Access for All UsCC subcommittee members for their support. He expressed his desire to partner with the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health to provide services to the largest number of people with disabilities in the United States.
- Roque Bucton was honored to have served as Co-Chair for the Access for All UsCC subcommittee.
 He continues to be involved with the Access for All subcommittee. He is currently contracted by Painted Brain to work on the Mental Health Needs Assessment projects.
- Sunnie Whipple thanked the Access for All UsCC subcommittee for the opportunity to run for the Co-Chair position.

E. Capacity Building Projects - Roque Bucton / Painted Brains

- The Resource Guide is divided into basic sectors for the visually impaired, hearing impaired and mobility impaired. There will also be a General section.
- The Resource Guide will be produced in hard copy and in digital file format (in all three versions).
- Roque advised the group to email Rosario Ribleza at <u>rribleza@dmh.lacounty.gov</u> for any input or feedback on the resource guide.
- Will start to develop flyers and focus groups questions for subcommittee's review and feedback.

The following issues were discussed related to services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community in the Los Angeles County:

- 1. There are no contracted agencies to serve the deaf and hard of hearing adult community.
- 2. Challenges with the use/access of technology. Untrained ASL interpreters
 - A female client may feel uncomfortable with a male ASL translator or vice versa.
 - The constant changing of ASL interpreters, does not build a direct rapport with meeting attendees
- 3. No ADA Coordinator
- Hector Ramirez stated that the department should have a Patient's Right Advocate that helps facilitate accommodations. DMH and MHSA funded services are Federally mandated and should be ADA accessible.
- Amy Kay commented that the department has a huge gap of services and there are no agencies in the Los Angeles County to serve the adult Deaf and Hard of Hearing community.
- Amy emphasized that interpreters must be well-trained. Untrained interpreters can cause misunderstanding, and misdiagnosis can happen.
- Cody Hanable suggested that there is a need for Spanish speaking sign language interpreters as well as trilingual interpreters.

DMH Response: Debbie Innes-Gomberg

• The department decided to move the deployment and procuring of ASL services from the Access Center to Cultural Competency Unit.

	 DMH is working with the Chief Information Office (CIO) to create workforce, education, and training. The department is doing its best to improve accessibility. Dr. Jonathan Sherin He appreciated the subcommittee for all their great input to help improve ASL services in the department, and for communicating the needs of the community. He shared that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, mental health services are in high demand. There is a lack of clinicians but hiring is a problem due to limited budget and freeze hiring. He assured the subcommittee that the department is working diligently to fill the position of Patient Rights Coordinator and to hire an ADA coordinator. He also expressed the importance of having access to communication and academic institutions regardless of of individual's culture. Dr. Jorge Partida The process of hiring Promoters is active. Human Resources (HR) is doing special canvassing to include folks who would actually meet the criteria. The intension is to include Access for All population, so DMH is partnering with the Los Angeles City College for recruitment of competent Promoters. He stated that there is no data that represent the needs of services for the deaf and hard of hearing. Amy reported that 5 Acres provided data to DMH for three (3) years. Roque Bucton requested for the data, and Dr. Sherin gave instructions to DMH staff to look for the data submitted by 5 Acres.
