Welcome & Introductions - Subcommittee	Attendee introductions: Each attendee (On Microsoft Teams and on the phone) was encouraged to incorporate a description of themselves to be mindful of those attendees with disabilities: individuals with visual impairments who cannot see the computer screen, and those who cannot hear what is happening in the meeting.
Meeting Norms/Review of Code of Conduct – Co- Chair	Cody Hanable reviewed the Code of Conduct and Meeting Norms to the subcommittee.
Meeting Minutes: Review and Approval	The subcommittee decided that August 11 , 2021 meeting minutes be carried over for next month's meeting.
General Updates:	 A. DMH Updates – Pinki Mehta 1. ADA Coordinator – DMH is working with the County Council to figure out how to incorporate ADA requirements with the Federal law. 2. Deaf Mental Health Services for Adult

- a. Pinki is trying to schedule a meeting with the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) Deaf and Hard of Hearing staff to learn how they provide services to the population.
- b. DMH Contract Division and Five Acres are going to work together to look into expanding appropriate services for the deaf and hard of hearing communities.
- c. DMH is also expanding the capacity of its directly operated clinics and provide appropriate training to ensure that clients of all ages (TAY up to older adult) are provided with the needed services.
- 3. Capacity Building Project Budget DMH will try to increase funding for FY 2022-2023 Capacity Building Projects
- 4. Call Center there is a plan to modernize the Call Center to make it more accessible and to ensure that services are more culturally appropriate and relevant.
- **B.** Capacity Building Projects Roque Bucton presented the Resource Guides, flyers, and focus group questions for the three (3) Capacity Building Projects: a) Mental Health Assessment for the Blind, Partially Sighted, and Visually Impaired; b) Mental Health Assessment for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing; and c) Mental Health Assessment for Physically Disabled Community. There are 24 copies of flyers printed in Braile for the blind individuals.

 Suggestions: All materials must be written in simple languages and include different available accommodations.
