

# ▶ ▶ We Are Here to Help

TAY Navigation Team consists of a Mental Health Navigators, Medical Case Workers (MCW), a Substance Use Counselor and an Employment Specialist (see page 7 for roster).

Navigators provide clinical consultations to county departments and organizations while outreaching and engaging Transitional Age Youth (TAY) that are referred. The team's primary role is to assist youth, ages 18-25, often unhoused and with mental health challenges, through the various human service systems to link to mental health services, housing, and other community resources.

Teams work in **Enhanced Emergency Shelters (EESP)** for TAY, and community-based Drop-In Centers (see page 6) to provide short-term treatment, conduct brief screenings to assess mental health and housing needs, and provide linkages and referrals.

The **Enhanced Emergency Shelter Program (EESP)** is a 60-day temporary shelter for Transition Age Youth (TAY) who are:

- between 18-25 years old
- unhoused or at risk of being unhoused in Los Angeles County
- experiencing mental health issues
- willing to seek mental health treatment
- no income or low income and unable to pay for housing
