The program serves children in the community, as well as those children involved in the child welfare system with an emphasis on foster children who are transitioning to adoption and post adoption mental health services. In addition, the program services birth parents with early intervention and prevention evidence-based treatments that are attachment focused. Other services include developmental, psychological testing, psychiatric and medical evaluations. Finally, the clinic offers Multi-disciplinary Assessment Team (MAT) to all children who are newly entered into foster care. Individual, family, and group services are offered. In addition, there are parent education workshops offered for the members of the general community.

Training in assessment and treatment of infants, toddlers, and young children as well as working with adolescents and their families. Unique opportunities for exposure to Evidence Based Practices of: Child Parent Psychotherapy, Parent Child Interaction Therapy, and Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral therapy. On site, there are certified supervisors for Infant and Child mental health, CPP, PCIT, and Play therapy.

Child Parent Psychotherapy, Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, Parent Child Interaction Therapy, Play Therapy, Infant Massage, Attachment theory.
