SPEAKER BIOS

She was born in Armenia and raised in Armenia/Russia. She also lived in India and while working for United Nations and other humanitarian agencies in the world she had the opportunity to live and work in different parts of the world. Her passion has always been to reach out to people in need and hence she chose the field of psychology and social work services. Artur Asaduriyan, Clergy, is the founder of Apologia Center and teaching Elder at Anchor Church. He was born in Armenia and migrated to the United States at the age of 11 with his family. Artur started his formal education at LIFE Pacific University and earned a B.A. in Biblical Studies with a Minor in Education. He went on to earn a M.A. in Philosophy from Talbot School of Theology. He is married to Araz and they have three children; Avetis, Nairi and Vahagn.

Khachatur Gasparyan, Ph.D. received his doctorate in clinical psychology Lomonosov Moscow State University (MSU), postgraduate in refugee studies at Programme Oxford University, UK, and completed postdoctoral research in clinical child psychiatric epidemiology at Columbia University, New York, USA. He currently is the Medical Psychology Department Chair at Yerevan State Medical University After Mkhitar Heratsi, Chief Psychologist of INTRA Mental Health Center, adjunct lecturer at American University of Armenia (AUA), and advisor and member of Public Counsel to the Ministry of Defense.

Lilit Hovsepyan, Psy.D., is a pre-licensed clinical psychologist (PSY #94025619) who works with youth, adults, and families. She specializes in anxiety disorders, Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD), autism spectrum disorder, and birth to 5 population. Her clinical experience in these and other areas is supplemented by research projects and psychological assessments. Dr. Hovsepyan received her Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) in clinical psychology from Loma Linda University in 2020.
