EMPOWERING CONVERSATIONS

- Background
 - In partnership with the Black Mental Health Task Force and Department of Mental Health, Therapeutic Play Foundation set out to:
 - Increase Access to Mental Health
 - Destigmatize Issues facing the Black/African American Community in Los Angeles County
 - Empower Los Angeles County to educate Stakeholders and take action to reduce disparities
 - 1 time each month Therapeutic Play Foundation held a conversation series event

Empowering Black Families Conversation Series

- Mental Health Services and education to develop awareness and destigmatize mental health in the communities most affected.
- Workshops A series of six Wellness
 Conversations that focus on
 important topics, primarily in the
 Black community, such as

- Destigmatizing Mental Health in the Black community
- Transitional Age Youth
- Supporting New and Expecting Black Parents
- LGBTQ+ in the Black Community
- · Black and Unhoused
- Cannabis in the Black Community

REACH AND RESULTS

- Participants were diverse in background including at least 50% Black/African American were participants at each event
 - Gave a voice and platform to discuss issues facing their community (e.g., housing, marijuana, parenting, etc.)
 - Participants attended across job sectors (law enforcement, healthcare, social workers, business, and students
 - Events were held virtually with the pandemic but also helped to increase reach

Community Healing Circle, Sound Bath & Conversations

Therapeutic Play Foundation hosted various events for their Empowering Wellness Conversation Series!

- Discussion on important topics affecting this community
- Those who joined came to listen & learn from this community & its leaders

 health issues and increase awareness of healthy
 coping strategies, connect community members
 to supportive resources and services needed to
 improve opportunities for healing.



RESULTS

- Pre and Post surveys were conducted for each event and a Gala held at the end of the Conversation Series asked participants to provide their testimonials.
 - 160 Participants took the pre and post surveys
- Participants reported on surveys:
 - Events were well-organized
 - Felt more Empowered and confident after the events to help tackle issues facing the Black Community
 - Participants felt they learned a lot, as reported in their testimonials

MINDING OUR VILLAGE ELDERS

- Background
 - Designed to develop Community Service Leaders who can hold workshops and teach tools for Elderly Individuals in Los Angeles County
 - Teach tools to reduce isolation, feelings of loneliness, and disconnect in the Black Elderly Community
 - CSLs held workshops on mental health, nutrition, self-care, etc.
 - A total of 15 workshops were held with at least 3 participants at each workshop
 - Total of more than 100 participants attended at least 1 workshop

RESULTS

- Pre and Post for CSLs:
 - CSLs were asked to take a survey before and after their training
 - On average they felt more prepared and more confident to educate and provide tools to elderly in their community after the training
- Pre and Post for Participants:
 - 87 participants took both pre and post survey
 - At least 50% of all participants were Black Elderly Individuals
 - Feelings of worry, awareness of community resources, and their community positively impacting their psychological well-being were:
 - significant positive changes from pre to post: Meaning, worry reduced, awareness increased, and feelings about their community changed






