The Santa Clarita Valley Mental Health Center (SCVMHC) is directly-operated by Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health.

Since 1974, SCVMHC has provided a range of mental health services to individuals 18 years of age and older who are experiencing symptoms of mental illness. Our center has been at our current location, 23501 Cinema Drive, Valencia, CA, since 2008.

The Staff

Services are provided by a well-trained, and experienced multi-disciplinary treatment team including: psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, psychiatric technicians, clinical social workers, medical case workers, community workers, occupational therapists, and substance abuse counselors.
