DMH HIRING EFFORTS TO DATE

- FY 2021-22: 519 hires / promotions
- From July 2022 February 2023:
 - 227 hires / 392 promotions: 619 hires & promotions
- <u>Clinic Programs</u>: (Adult Outpatient, Child / Family Outpatient, Full Service Partnership)
 - ⊲ For the month of February 2023:
 - 31 positions filled
 - 72 positions pending hiring transactions (candidates selected/ pending/start dates pending)
 - 192 positions currently in stages of recruitment (actively interviewing)

CalAIM UPDATE

- BH Payment Reform is rolling out July 1, 2023. The finance division has been working across all divisions to prepare the programs and contractors for the upcoming changes
- DMH continues to meet regularly with the health plans to ensure that services are being delivered to our shared members
- DMH is currently providing ECM to adults with Serious Mental Illness (SMI) and Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
- DMH and DPH SAPC worked together to submit their second round of documents to DHCS for BHQIP incentive payment 2

CARE ACT UPDATE

- DMH continues the DMH internal workgroup
- DMH continues to participate in the CBHDA 1st Cohort Counties workgroup
- DMH participated in a 1st Cohort Counties meeting with CalHHS on 3/10/23 in Sacramento
- CEO has established a workgroup including county departments and Superior Court. There is a retreat 3/24/23
- CEO participates in a 1st Cohort Counties workgroup. Acting Chief Deputy Director Connie Draxler attends with CEO Fesia Davenport
- DMH will begin presentations to stakeholders, community groups, etc. In collaboration with CEO, DMH will begin drafting a communications strategy including a website and FAQ
- 1st Cohort Counties are waiting on decisions regarding court forms and rules from Judicial Council and waiting on funding for legal representation agencies for CARE participants
- County continues to advocate for additional funding from the State for CARE Act implementation
