FINAL REPORT SUKH SHANTI: Promoting Mental Health Wellness in South Asian Americans



Project







PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Saahas for Cause's project was selected by the API Underserved Cultural Communities (UsCC) subcommittee to be implemented from August 2022 to July 2023. The two service areas selected are in the San Fernando Valley and South East LA. Our project targets the South Asian immigrant population of Los Angeles who speak Hindi, Punjabi and Gujarati. The Consultant focused on developing informational workshops, attendance sheets, and surveys for each workshop. A description of the project development is as follows:

- I. Develop pre & post questionnaires for each workshop and intergenerational (IG) conversation panel discussion.
- II. Recruit and train Community Health Workers to do one-on-one outreach with the workshop attendees.
- III. Develop workshop curriculum, short plays, podcasts and brief Public Service Announcements (PSAs).
 - Short Plays: Canvassing in South Asian Clubs in universities
- Podcasts; Nikhil to Nick podcast by Saahas Youth (https://podcasts.apple.com/us/podcast/nikhil-to-nick/id1543089202?i=1000585012807)
- IV. Develop marketing material for event-fliers and educational handouts.
- V. Intergenerational Conversation Workshops
 - Workshops were worked on for 6 months
 - Workshop topics: Immigration & Acculturation, Anxiety, Depression
 - Recruited participants for IG panel from both Service Area 2 (SA2) and Service Area 7 (SA7)
 - Intergenerational Conversations included panel discussions on issues that different immigrant generations face due to inter-generational conflicts and acculturation differences.
- VI. Secure workshop locations- identified South Asian organizations that already work with the South Asian population in our targeted service areas and added workshops to their existing platform.
- VII. Implementing workshops in SA2 and SA7 locations.

OBJECTIVE

To bring awareness and education to the members of South Asian communities in service area 2 & 7, in mental health related topics. And to also make them aware of available resources, means and materials which can aid in their healing. Overall, through these workshops and panels, Saahas for Cause would like to highlight the importance of getting assistance for mental health and breaking the stigma around mental health.

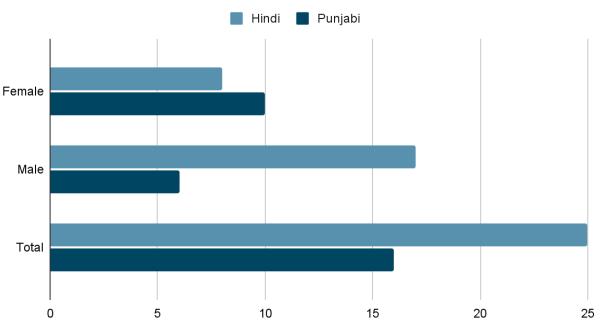
Summary of participant demographics

The Sukh Shanti workshop participants were from zip codes in LA County. Participants from Service Area 7 were residents of Artesia (90701), Cerritos (90703), Norwalk (90650), and La Mirada (90638). Participants from Service Area 2 were residents of Santa Clarita (91390), Simi Valley (93063), Pacoima (91331), and Northridge (91324). The ages of the audience ranged from 15 to 94 years old where the majority of the audience fell in the 30-40 and 60-80-year-old age range. There were 120 males and 198 females making a total of 318 people recorded from attendance sheets. This project includes South Asian communities with the following linguistic capacities: Hindi, Punjabi, Gujarati. The majority of attendees identified as Indian with 1 participant identifying as Bangladeshi and 2 identifying as Pakistani. There were also 275 first-generation attendees, 40 second-generation attendees, and 3 third-generation attendees.

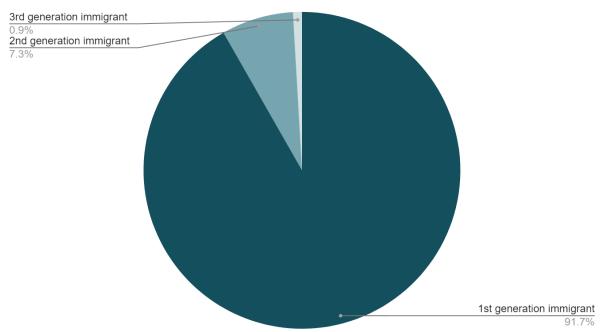
Workshops: Service Area 7 Age Range



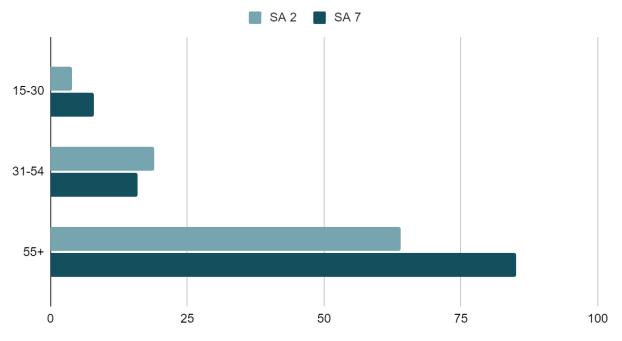
Workshops: Service Area 2 Immigration Level



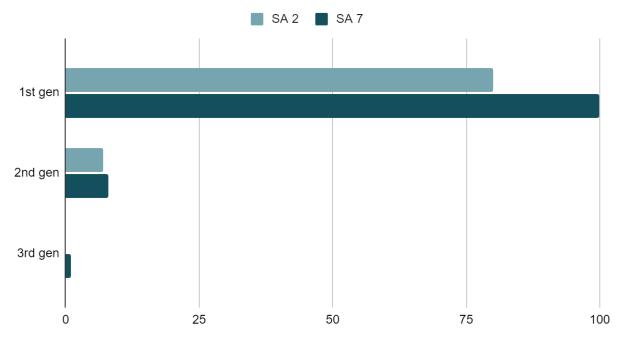

Workshops: Age Range Comparison for SA 2 and SA 7



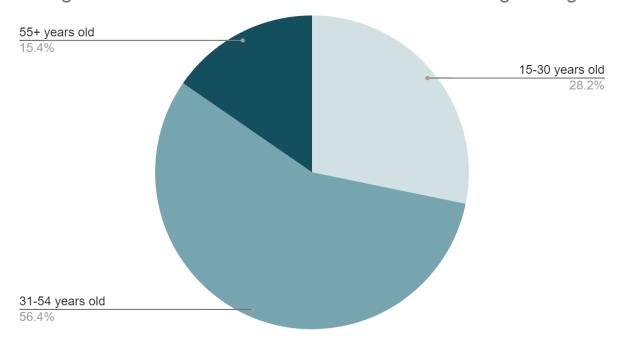

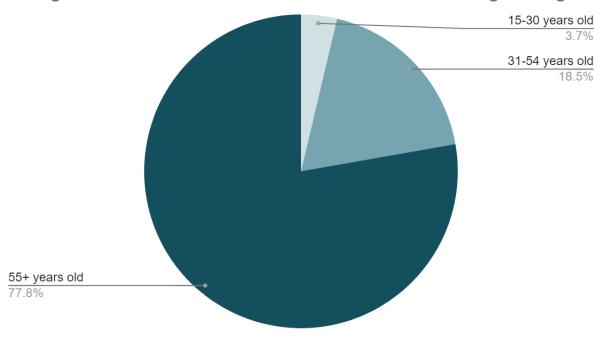

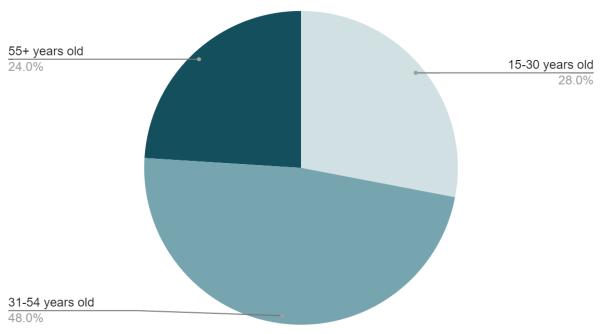
Intergenerational Conversations 1: Service Area 2 Age Range



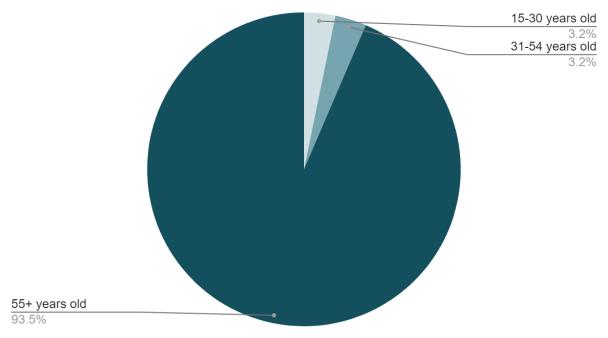
Intergenerational Conversations 2: Service Area 2 Age Range



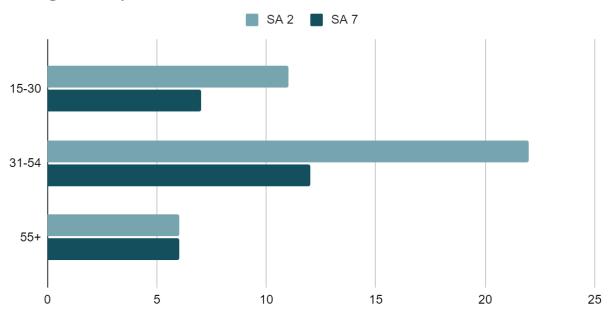
Intergenerational Conversations 1: Service Area 7 Age Range



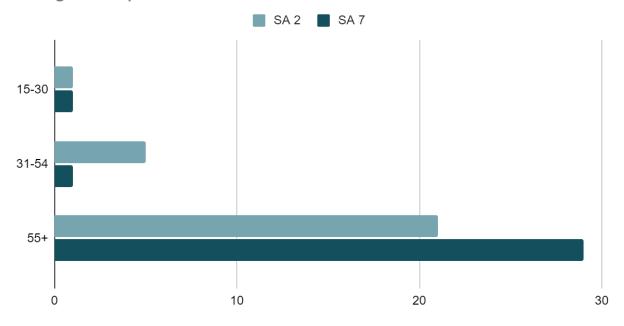

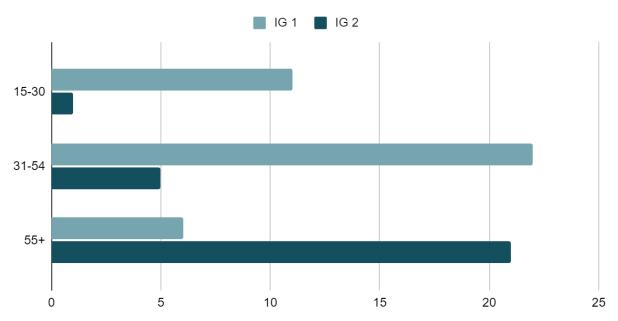
Intergenerational Conversations 1: Service Area 2 & 7 Age Range Comparisons



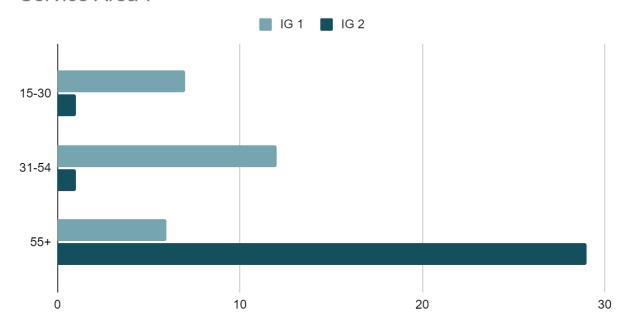

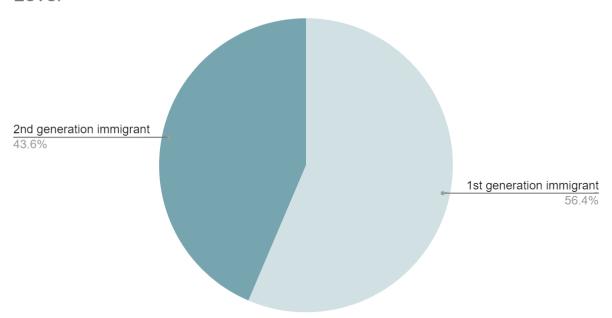
Intergenerational Conversations 1 & 2 Age Range Comparison: Service Area 2



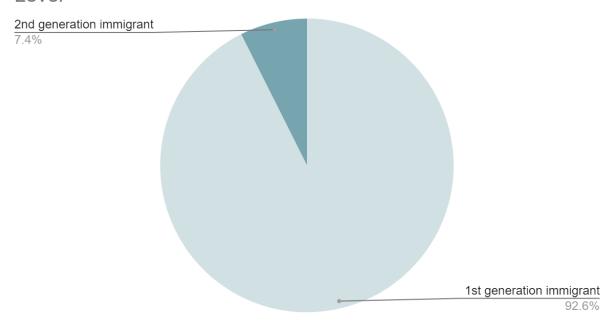
Intergenerational Conversations 1 & 2 Age Range Comparison: Service Area 7



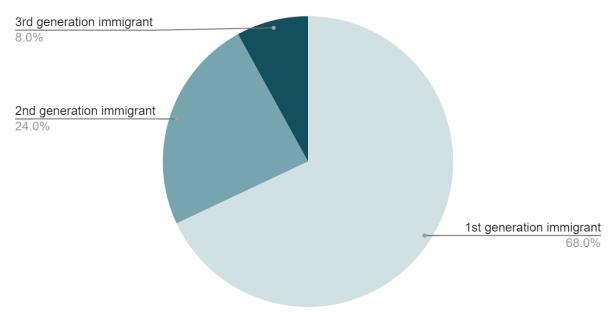
Intergenerational Conversations 1: Service Area 2 Immigration Level



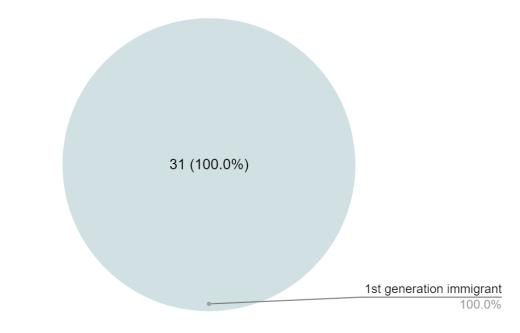

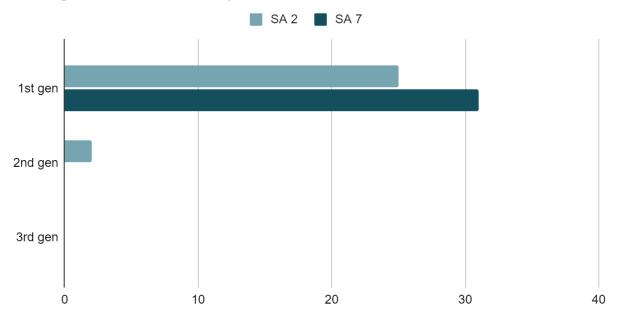

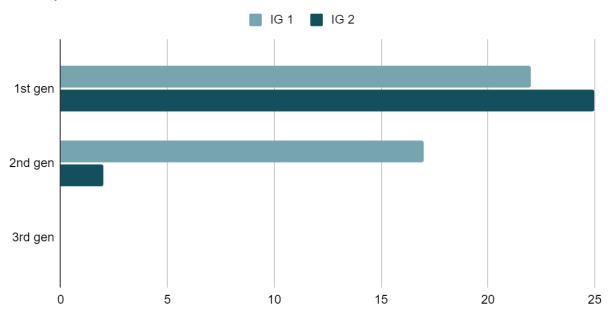
Intergenerational Conversations 1: Service Area 2 & 7 Immigration Level Comparisons



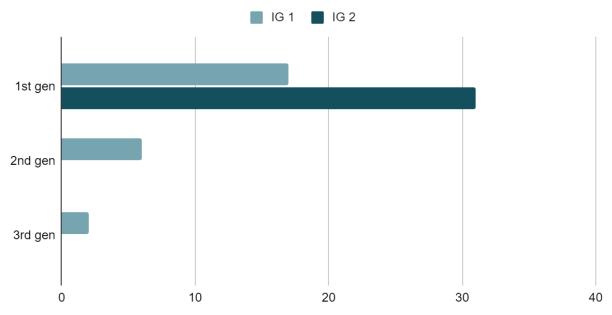
Intergenerational Conversations 2: Service Area 2 & 7 Immigration Level Comparisons

PROJECT OUTCOME

- Enhance mental health and wellness of South Asian immigrant families.
- Increase the community's understanding of mental health.
- Connect them to available resources by providing relevant mental health education and outreach and engagement in the form of multi-generational workshops and short plays.
- Reduce the stigma surrounding mental health for the South Asian community living in Los Angeles County by providing a space for them to talk about mental health in a culturally congruent setting with bilingual, bicultural South Asian mental health community ambassadors.
- The project resulted in making helpful information on mental health & wellness.
- Information videos were created that can be circulated around the community used as a teaching device
- The project fostered conversations within the South Asian community around difficult and diverse opinions and perspectives.

COMPREHENSIVE ANALYSIS

A comprehensive analysis of the pre-and post-questionnaires was undertaken per the project's objectives. Participants' pre-intervention responses were directly compared to their corresponding post-survey responses using a matched-pair approach, giving us insights into the individual changes throughout the workshops.

This analysis began with calculating descriptive statistics for pre- and post-survey responses. This included measures of central tendency and variabilities such as means and standard deviations. The pre-and post-responses for each participant were then compared to understand the magnitude and direction of change for everyone.

To assess the overall effectiveness of the intervention, paired-t-tests samples for means were used. These tests statistically analyzed the average difference in scores before and after the workshops. Visual representations, including graphs and charts, were also developed to aid in interpreting these results.

Upon comprehensive analysis of the pre-and post-questionnaire responses using a matched-pair format, it was found that most of the measured variables did not yield statistically significant results. However, a case of significance was found in the workshop dated 5/23/2023, SA2

"Rethinking Your Anxiety". Analysis revealed a statistically significant difference between this specific pre- and post-survey responses.

Survey of audience to measure the level of knowledge gained:

Teach-back method:

During our workshop, we would pause to involve the attendees to repeat back to us what they learnt in the session. We ensured their involvement and assessed their understanding of the concepts such as symptoms of anxiety and depression, bicultural parenting, types of anxiety, and process of acculturation.

Pre & post surveys:

We administered pre and posttest before and after the workshop to assess the level of knowledge gained during the workshop. The Saahas staff and volunteers would verbally translate the questions as well as the options as per participants' requests. Translations were made in Hindi, Gujarati, and Punjabi. Saahas team made sure that there were Bilingual staff members and volunteers present for each session in order to have the translations made available.

Feedbacks and Testimonials:

"This is such an important topic (intergenerational conversations) that needs more conversations. Thank you Saahas for providing this platform"

"This platform provided us space for 2 generations to communicate our issues and understand each other's perspective. It is nice to see that these youth understand where the parents come from. Navigating 2 cultures is not easy."

"We need more of these sessions. This session was so good. I loved the organic and active discussion happening in the chat session amongst the attendees. Parenting is such an important topic, we struggle with our parenting issues, never knew this discussion would be so helpful."

"As a parent of a young child, it was good to get all this insight on bicultural parenting and the topic of acculturation. It helps me understand better what the potential parent child conflicts could be and prepare to handle it better"

"We never speak about mental health in our homes or social circles. It is not easy to find support for such issues. Thank you for speaking for the workshop. We would like to be part of more such workshops."

"You all do such a fantastic job of bringing these topics to us. There was so much trauma about what we went through (racism). It is better now, we had to endure so much and we hardly spoke about it in any social forum. This platform (Humari Kahani workshop) gave me the opportunity to talk about these events and the trauma I endured."

Overall,

Through the data collected, we have found that there was a majority of community members which did not consider mental health as a means which could be helped through professional mental health resources in the neighborhood, let alone know of these resources in their respective communities. It was after the workshops, that these participants were brought to awareness of not only the mental health concepts, but also the resources available in their neighborhoods.

LESSONS LEARNED

Successes that were achieved by the Sukh Shanti project include recruiting community members to do outreach and foster community engagement with its members.

A challenge that was faced was working with South Asian college clubs to develop outlines for members to share their stories. While they were enthusiastic to participate, the delivery was done poorly as many of them were not ready to be on camera or take part in short plays. Saahas staff and youth then had to step in to complete it.

There was also a challenge with the pre and post surveys' effectiveness as participants sometimes lacked the motivation to complete them and could have impacted the data with the different levels of understanding of certain topics.

In administering the pre and post surveys, we also faced a challenge where people were not motivated to administer them during outreaches, requiring more manpower to individually administer them.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Some recommendations for LACDMH on how to improve outreach and engagement to the South Asian community include:

Providing handouts for members to respond to need, and to make the workshops more audience-involved. Providing space for sharing experiences and adding games and videos to keep it entertaining yet informative has been found to be effective.

Some suggestions to better approach this was learning how to incorporate better tools to record this data and adjusting the survey questionnaires to be more specific to rule out ambiguity.

Providing space for clinicians, social workers and community health workers to meet in person and discuss the nuances of this project on a regular basis to help with the foundation of the work to be led with the community.

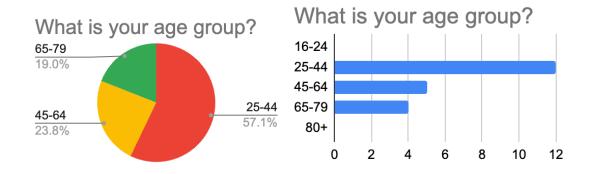
