MEDI-CAL MANAGED CARE PLANS AND SCREENING AND TRANSITION OF CARE TOOLS

LA County DMH works closely with a total of 6 LA County Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans to adhere to new State guidelines around transition of care for shared members between specialty and non-specialty mental health systems.

Topic	Details
Health Systems	 The Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans are responsible for providing mild/moderate mental health services as the Medi-Cal Health Plan while DMH provides specialty mental health services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries as the Mental Health Plan. Coordinating care and expanding partnerships with MCPs is critical as enrollment as the State is enrolling 90% of Medi-Cal beneficiaries into an MCP by EOY.
State Requirements	In January 2023, the State standardized, state-wide adult and youth screening and transition of care tools to ensure timely coordination between behavioral health systems under the CalAIM initiative.
New Screening and Transition of Care Tools	 Adult and Youth Screening Tool: This tool determines the appropriable mental heath delivery system referrals for beneficiaries who are not currently receiving care in one of the mental health systems. Through a standardized scoring tool, the score determines which system the beneficiary should receive an assessment. Transition of Care Tool: A standard tool that leverages existing clinical information to document a beneficiary's mental health needs and facilitates a referral for a transition of care from the beneficiary's MCP or MHP, as needed.
Partnerships with Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans	 DMH has developed a direct referrals email inbox for our MCP partners to refer beneficiaries to our system via the screening and transition of care tools. DMH will set-up the appointment for an assessment at a DMH clinic. MCPs are also receiving the screening and transition of care tools that DMH sends to them. Processes vary among the plans on how appointments are made – some patients are given #s and must make the outreach and appointment themselves.

Question 1: Does the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure (BHCIP) process exist in Service Area 6?

Response: Yes.

LA ALLIANCE UPDATE

- LA Alliance/County Settlement-Judge Carter signed and accepted the settlement agreement on September 28, 2023
- 3000 new (starting from June 2022) mental health/substance use disorder beds (various types)
- 450 new enhanced rate subsidies for licensed Adult Residential Facilities (ARFs) and Residential Care Facilities for the Elderly (RCFEs)
- Dedicated to homeless population with high acuity mental health and/or substance use needs

LA ALLIANCE UPDATE

- DMH's Current/Planned Inventory (June 2022-December 2024): 1695
 - Planned Inventory is contingent on completing construction or rehabilitation
- Various Funding Streams including, but not limited to:
 - Community Care Expansion (CCE)
