DESCRIPTION: The goal of this training is to enhance forensic mental health professionals' ability to identify risk factors of violent behavior and how to accurately assess consumers who are escalating and/or potentially violent. This training educates DMH clinical staff and DMH contracted agency staff on contemporary issues regarding overall threat assessments with discussions including clinical issues, assessment techniques, veracity dynamics and working with dangerous consumers. Other topics will address targeted violence such as social media bullying, triggering events, and contagion periods. Participants will learn how to conduct threat assessments. This will include discussions about the goals of a threat assessment, types of threats, and the various levels of threat (i.e., suicidal, homicidal, and homicidal-suicidal states of mind).

TARGET AUDIENCE: Registration is limited to staff from AB109, Men's & Women's Community Reintegration, Mental Health Court Linkage, and contracted agencies working with these programs
