## *Conference Summary*



This Southern California conference is part of the California Mental Health and Spirituality Initiative, a joint effort by California counties and the California Institute for Mental Health. The purposes of the conference are (1) to increase awareness of spirituality as a potential resource in mental health prevention, early intervention, and recovery; and (2) to encourage collaboration among faith-based organizations, mental health service providers, consumers and families in combating stigma and reducing disparities in access to services for diverse populations.

The Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health will host this Southern California conference featuring pastoral ministers who have gone “outside the box” and instituted services to underserved communities. It will also highlight mental health experts who have researched the integration of spirituality in the recovery of multi-ethnic consumers and in the survival of families beset with mental illness. This conference will educate, motivate and inspire the inclusion of spirituality in one’s journey to being whole.
