Trauma can be processed and healing can begin through the arts, imagination, and creativity. In this experiential half day intensive, we will use creative arts materials and processes to explore meaningful encounters in the workplace and consider the dynamics of creating 'safe spaces' for self-expression, dialogue, and healing for ourselves, our colleagues and the children and families we serve. In the morning, we will explore these themes using collage within a Mandala art experience to explore the process of creating safe spaces for healing encounters in our work. In the afternoon, we will engage in a three dimensional experiential arts process and creative writing to gain insight into our role in fostering resilience in the context of loss and trauma.
