DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation (LA County Parks) manages 182 parks with over 475 sports amenities, operates a network of 9 regional parks, 38 neighborhood parks, 20 community parks, 15 wildlife sanctuaries, 10 nature centers, 36 public swimming pools, more than 200 miles of multi-use trails for hiking, biking, and horseback riding, and the largest municipal golf system in the nation, consisting of 20 golf courses. LA County Parks local and community parks offer a wide variety of parks and amenities such as playgrounds, skateparks, gyms, recreation centers, athletic facilities, dog parks serving the unincorporated areas.

The Department also maintains four botanical gardens and two performance venues: The Los Angeles County Arboretum and Botanic Garden, the South Coast Botanic Garden, Descanso Gardens, Virginia Robinson Gardens, Hollywood Bowl and John Anson Ford Amphitheatre providing County residents with valuable recreation and cultural and historic resources and experiences.

To advance its mission and further the health and wellness of unincorporated Los Angeles County communities, LA County Parks offers core programming for children, youth, adults and older adults. Examples of programs include summer camps, after-school programs, youth sports, contract classes, arts and culture, older adults programming, nutrition lunch and snack programs for youth and families, aquatics and a robust parentship and core and community partnership agreement program.

LA County Parks Operations Plan for fiscal year 2021/2022 was developed with centering equity, access and commitment to programming. The hours of operations of parks and programs promote equitable access to the public. The Operations Plan also provides an overview of the key core programs offered by LA County Parks, information on the rental fees to access the facilities and provides important contact information for the main offices.

Community and Cultural Events

The Department supports a variety of community special events each year. Department-wide, we will host four community special events. These longstanding events are the hallmark of recreation programs in how they bring communities and families together around seasonal holiday celebrations and cultural gatherings that include Halloween, Thanksgiving and winter and spring holidays.

Every Body Plays Drop-in Recreation

Provides access to outdoor recreation equipment that can be checked out by children and their families. Offered Monday through Friday from 2:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at select parks. Youth can check out sports equipment for FREE to get active and stay healthy in a safe place. Equipment varies by park location and may include; tennis racquets and balls, basketballs, soccer balls, carom tables, games, hula hoops and jump ropes. The snack program is offered at eligible Every Body Plays park from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. *Refer to APPENDIX C for a list of Every Body Plays parks

Every Body Plays Drop-in Summer Adventures

Offered from 11:00 am to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday at select parks. This FREE non-custodial 8-week drop-in program launches June 15 and runs until August 6. All COVID-19 safety guidelines are fully adhered to. Children can enjoy lunch at the park with their friends before joining the fun at select parks from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m. daily via a grab-n-go service delivery. Snack will be served Monday through Friday from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 pm. The program provides children ages 7 through 17 with access to caring and trained park staff who serve as mentors and lead an array of programs and activities. These activities range from sports, fitness, arts and crafts, STEM, group games, story time and so much more. *Refer to APPENDIX C for a list of Every Body Plays parks

Every Body Plays After-School Drop-In

This FREE 35-week drop-in program is offered from after-school until 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday during the school year. Children are provided with a healthy snack from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. This program launched September 6, 2021 and runs until May 27, 2022. These activities range from sports, fitness, arts and crafts, STEM, group games, story time and so much more. Every Body Explores

The program will be offered Tuesday through Saturday. Every Body Explores is designed for persons of all ages and introduces participants to the natural world through safe discovery and exploration in nature. The program provides participants with an opportunity to discover and explore the natural areas park through interpretive displays and participation in a community science, observation gathering, scavenger hunt. They will also have the opportunity to create a natural journal and other fun nature-based crafts that encourage connecting with the natural world.

Every Body Swims

Every Body Swims is a drop-in recreation swim program that is available to the community. It is a FREE drop-in program.

Nature Center Discovery

Superintendents at our Nature Centers will provide an overview of the cultural and historical context of the park including, unique environments that contain geologic features, flora and fauna. In addition, superintendents will provide information on hiking trails, volunteer programs, and best practices for being a good park steward. When possible, the Nature Center Discovery may also include a meet and greet with one of our Animal Ambassadors.

Every Body Plays Sports for All

Every Body Plays Sports for All clinics will be offered seasonally on Saturdays at selected LA County Parks locations in the morning and in the afternoon. Youth are encouraged to have fun, exercise, and develop a love for being active with basic skills training in soccer, basketball, baseball, softball, and additional sports. Pre-registration is required. Based on the ability of staffing, additional sites may be added throughout the year. The sports clinic is an 8-week program that will run on Saturdays.

Open Gym

Whether you want to play for fun, work on your individual skills, or just shoot around: Come show us what you got! Open gym is offered at indoor gyms to the public on a first come, first serve basis. Below is a list of indoor gym locations

Our SPOT

Our SPOT (Social Places and Opportunities for Teens) supports positive youth development through recreational experiences offered by caring and trained staff who serve as mentors. Our SPOT is a safe place for all teens in grades 7-12 to connect and make a real difference in their communities through social action projects. Youth explore their identity and build confidence through socially conscious curriculum on topics related to trauma-informed care and substance abuse prevention. Weekly artist experiences provide a space for youth to take up issues they care about using an artistic lens. The FREE program operates Monday through Friday from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. This program is funded by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health – Substance Abuse and Prevention Control Program (SAPC) and the Los Angeles County Department of Probation. LA County Parks offers facility use through reservations using ActiveNet

Amenities available for rent include picnic areas, sports fields and courts, indoor classrooms, multi-purpose rooms and outdoor grass areas. CONTRACT CLASS PROGRAM

LA County Parks' Contract Class Program builds strong and resilient communities and individuals by offering high quality recreational and enrichment opportunities while also making workforce investments in individuals and businesses local to our parks. Independent contract instructors bring valuable skills and expertise to provide the individuals and families with opportunities to learn new skills, stay active and healthy, and meet new people. Recreation and enrichment classes promote personal well-being among our communities and improve the lives of LA County residents. Programming ranged from a variety of recreation, education wellness and specialty classes, including yoga and meditation, sports skills, dance, fitness, visual arts and performing arts, computer programming and technology, and more.

Contract Class Program creates a nexus in programming with individuals and businesses to offer specialized classes at local parks, recreation and nature centers. LA County Parks provide class instructors with access to amenities including dance and art studios, classrooms, and outdoor spaces, so that the public may benefit from classes and workshops offered at their local parks. Instructors have the flexibility of hosting multiple class offerings on a seasonal basis. Instructors set the times, the number of weeks, registration, and supplies fees, as long as they both remain within the Department's preset programming season, and facilities are available. LA County Parks supports the Contract Class Program by facilitating online participant registration through Active Net, providing access to facilities, supporting an instructor portal to manage class rosters and attendance sheets, and promoting activities to the County's over 10 million residents. The Contract Class program enhances the opportunities for recreation when buildings are already open and staffed.

CORE AND COMMUNITY PROGRAM PARTNERSHIPS

LA County Parks partners with community-based organizations to expand youth access to programming like youth sports, science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics (STEAM) activities, environmental education, arts and culture, and community service. The Core and Community Partnership Program offers rentals of LA County Parks' facilities to qualified community organizations for no facility use fee or reduced facility use fee, depending on the program or service provided. The use of LA County Parks' facilities by community organizations expands park programming, provides benefits to the public and increases access to park facilities. Through these agreements, LA County Parks forges collaborative partnerships with committed community-based organizations and program providers. Eligible organizations can apply to become a Core Program Partner or a Community Program Partner, depending on the program or service provided, the type of direct benefits provided to LA County Parks, and the scope of partner responsibilities assumed by the organization.
