#### A. Prevailing Wages

Vendor, its agents, and employees will be bound by and must comply with all applicable provisions of the California Labor Code as well as all other applicable Federal, State, and local laws related to labor including compliance with prevailing wage laws. The services provided in an awarded contract may consist of both prevailing wage and non-prevailing wage work.
