- 2. Sonia Sotomayor First Hispanic (and third woman) to serve as Supreme Court Justice
- 3. Roberto Clemente Human rights activist, charity worker, baseball legend
- 4. Ellen Ochoa Engineer and astronaut, first Hispanic woman to go into space
- 5. Juan Felipe 21st U.S. Poet Laureate and first Mexican-American to hold that position
- 6. Raffi Freedman-Gurspan Transgender rights activist, first openly transgender person to work as a White House staffer
- 7. Sor Juana Inês de la Cruz 17th-century feminist writer and thinker, pioneer of women's rights, the first feminist author of the New World
- 8. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez Youngest congresswoman in United States history
- 9. Berta Cáceres Environmental activist, cofounded the Council of Popular and Indigenous Organizations of Honduras
- 10. Sylvia Mendez Paved the way for desegregation of schools in the U.S when in third grade, she became the first Mexican-American to go to an all-white school in California
- 11. Gloria Molina First Latina elected to the California Assembly, Los Angeles City Council, and Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors where she served for 23 years
- 12. Hilda Solis Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors for the 1st district
- 13. Rosario Dawson-Actress and producer, activist and philanthropist
- 14. Jorge Ramos Journalist and author
- 15. Octaviano Larrazola Governor of New Mexico in 1918, first Hispanic American to serve as a U.S. Senator.
- 16. Ritchie Valens Musician, introduced American audiences to Mexican music with La Bamba, Donna, and other hits.
- 17. Emma González Gun law reform advocate, survivor of school shooting when 17 of her fellow classmates were killed at Florida's Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in 2017
- 18. José Andrés Award winning and critically acclaimed chef and Humanitarian, nominated for the 2019 Nobel Peace Prize
- 19. Antonio Villaraigosa 41st Mayor of Los Angeles from 2005 to 2013, California State Assembly (1994–2000)
- 20. Sylvia Rivera LGBTQ rights pioneer, co-founder of the Gay Liberation Front
- 21. Dr. Adolfo Gonzales Chief Probation Officer for the Los Angeles County Probation Department
- 22. Lin-Manuel Miranda Composer, lyricist, actor, writer, and activist, creator of Hamilton the musical
- 23. Ileana Ros-Lehtinen First Hispanic woman to ever serve in the United States Congress
- 24. Rita Moreno First Hispanic woman to win an Academy Award, and is one of three people to hold the honor of being a "PEGOT" winner. (Peabody, Emmy, Grammy, Oscar, and Tony Award)
- 25. Gabriela Mistral Poet and educator, the first Hispanic person to win a Nobel Prize in Literature
