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Education Services

Senate Bill 716 (2019-2020) revised Welfare and Institutions Code § 889.2

889.2.

(a) It is the intent of the Legislature that juveniles with a high school diploma or California high school equivalency certificate who are detained in, or committed to, a juvenile ranch, camp, or forestry camp shall have access to rigorous postsecondary academic and career technical education programs that fulfill the requirements for transfer to the University of California and the California State University and prepare them for career entry, respectively.

The Los Angeles County Probation Department's Education Services Unit was recognized by the Youth Law Center for our work in advocating for this law.



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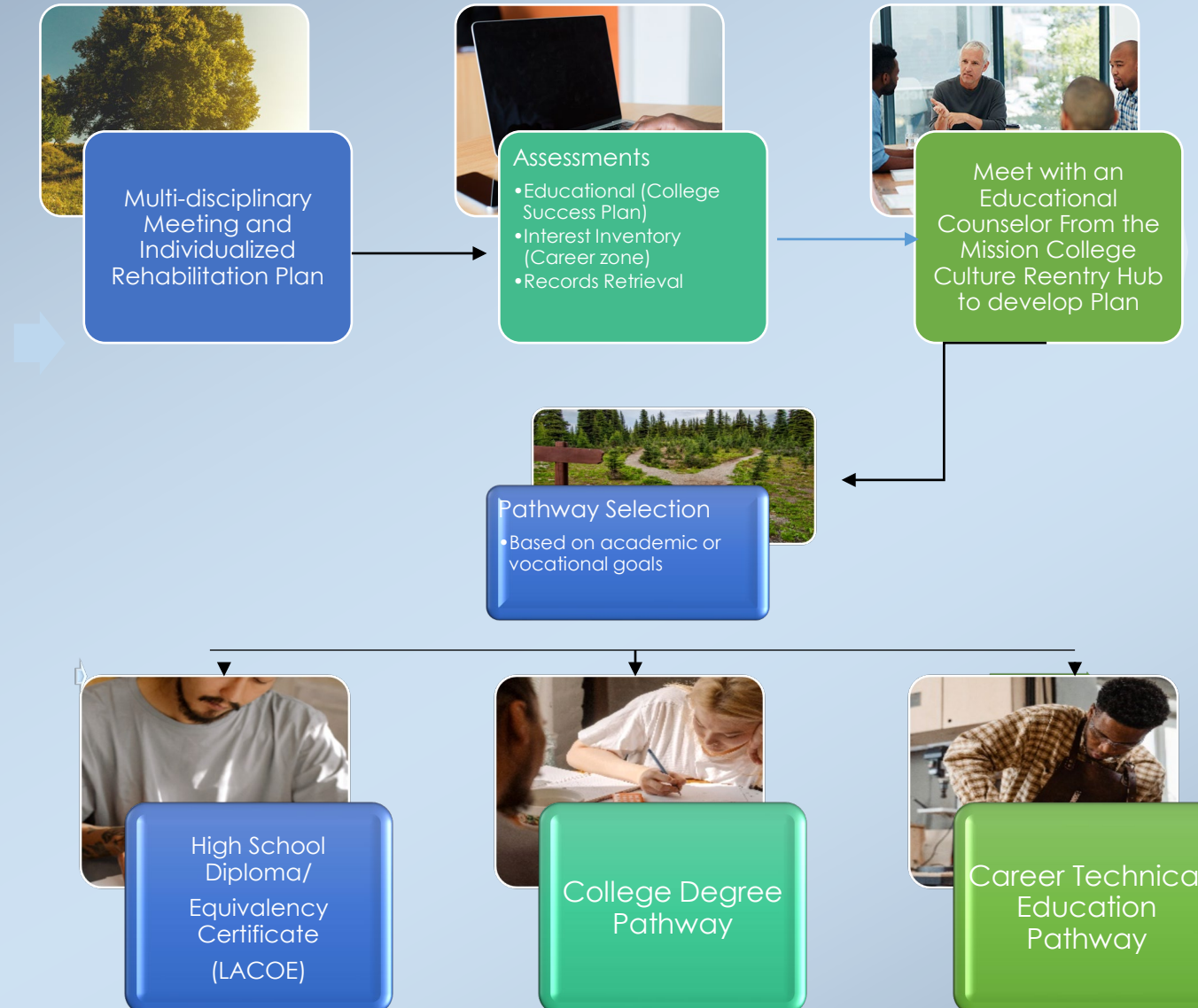
Post-secondary partners that are currently providing courses or services for Secure-Track students

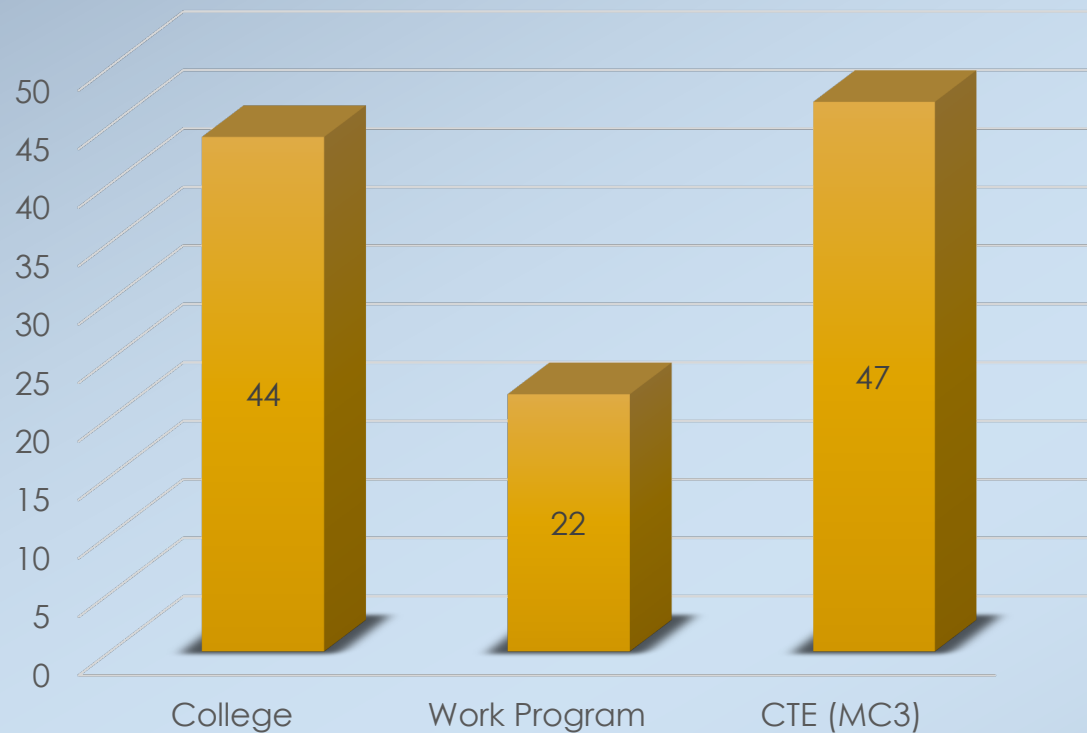


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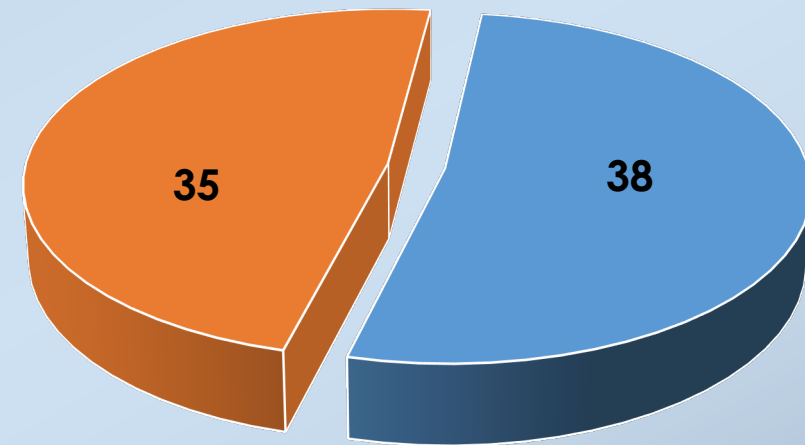

Of the Current 73 students identified as Secure-Track at Barry J. Nidorf and Campus Kilpatrick:

- 44 students have participated in college courses in the past three semesters.
- All 35 of the current High School Graduates have enrolled in college during the past three semesters.
- All of the Secure-Track students have access to a full-time dedicated college counselor from Los Angeles Mission College.
- The Mission College Counselor
 - Is on-site at Barry J. Nidorf an average of 2 days a week.
 - Assists Secure-Track students with career planning, creation of their college success plan, and education transition support.

Secure-Track Student College Success Stories:

- 4 students earned an Associate Degree
- 2 Secure track students are scheduled to earn their Associate Degree by the end of the Spring 2023 semester
- One of our current secure-track AA graduates was accepted to four universities, the student selected Oregon State University and is scheduled to begin classes in the Spring 2023 Semester.



Career-Technical Education

Five-Keys, LACOE, and Probation provide Secure-Track students at Barry J. Nidorf and Campus Kilpatrick with an opportunity to participate in the Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) apprenticeship-readiness training program. There are 41 students are enrolled in this program at Barry J. Nidorf, 6 students at Campus Kilpatrick are currently enrolled in MC3.

Career-Technical Education

- Secure-Track students are able to complete OSHA-10 certification in the following areas:
 - Construction
 - General industry
 - Automotive
 - Cosmetology
 - Culinary
 - Healthcare
 - Manufacturing
 - Veterinary
- Culinary Arts Instruction at Campus Kilpatrick is scheduled to resume in late March 2023. Students will be able to earn college credit while they learn industry-transferable skills in the culinary arts.
- Career exploration courses with Westcal Academy through Department of Rehabilitation funding are scheduled to begin in March 2023.



Youth Voter Registration

- Probation Education Services registers youth to vote throughout the year.
- During election season, eligible youth are able to cast a ballot.
- The Registrar-recorder's office determines which youth are eligible to vote after we submit their registrations.
- 27 youth at Barry J. Nidorf were able to cast their ballot during the November 2022 election.
