

Weekly Update: Aug 1, 2025

The Chief and Executive Leadership Present at Board of Supervisors Meeting

On July 29th, Chief Probation Officer Viera Rosa, Chief Deputy Sheila Williams, and Deputy Director Robert Arcos presented at the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors meeting. They provided an update on the Los Padrinos (LP) Depopulation, Recruitment, Court Updates, and the Attorney Generals announcement to file a motion to put the juvenile halls into a receivership.

Youth Movement

To date, five youth were released from Camp Paige, four were transferred to Camp Afflerbaugh and seven to Camp Rockey. Structural repairs to Camp Paige are in progress. Eight youth were transferred from Campus Kilpatrick to community step-down facilities and eight youth were transferred to Barry J. Nidorf Secure Youth Treatment Facility. Improvements are in progress to convert Campus Kilpatrick to female and gender expansive operations. The Department remains committed to exploring safe alternatives to incarceration within its scope of authority. However, the final decision regarding less restrictive options rests with the courts.

Recruitment

The Los Angeles County Probation Department continues to partner with the County's Department of Human Resources on ongoing recruitment efforts.

Court Update

The next Court date with Judge Espinoza is calendared for August 15, 2025.

Attorney Generals Receivership Announcement

On July 23rd, the state's Attorney General announced his intent to file a motion seeking to put the Department's juvenile hall/s into a receivership. The court hearing the motion gave the County 30 days to respond, and a court hearing is set for mid-September.
