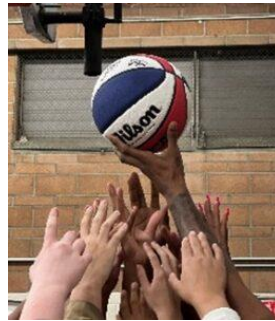
LEGENDS OF BASKETBALL VISIT PROBATION YOUTH FACILITIES

During All-Star Week 2026, the Los Angeles County Probation Department teamed up with Legends of Basketball and Hushed No More Presents for Rebound to Re-Entry, an initiative centered on mental wellness, resilience, and successful reentry.

From Feb. 10 to 12, retired athletes from the NBA, WNBA, ABA, and Harlem Globetrotters visited Los Padrinos Juvenile Hall, Camp Afflerbaugh, Camp Glenn Rockey, and Barry J. Nidorf Secure Youth Treatment Facility. Through small group talks and breakout sessions, they shared personal stories about pressure, change, and redefining success, giving youth practical tools and hope for the future.

The program reflects Probation's commitment to rehabilitation through mentorship, mental health awareness, and strong community partnerships, helping young people see new possibilities beyond the justice system.

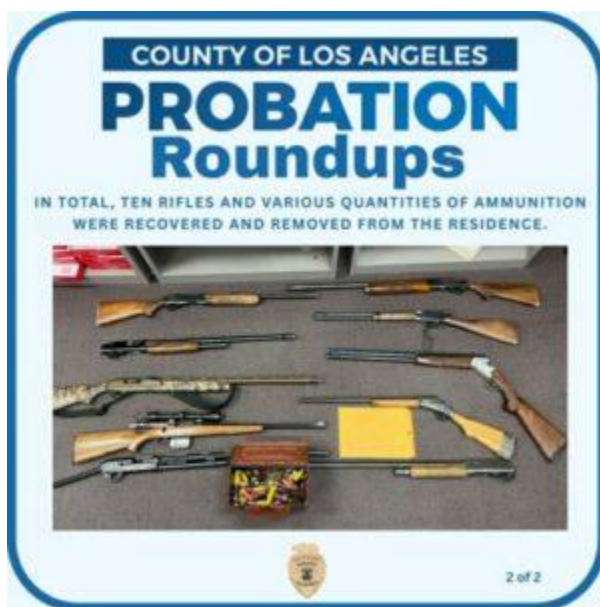

PROBATION ROUNDUPS

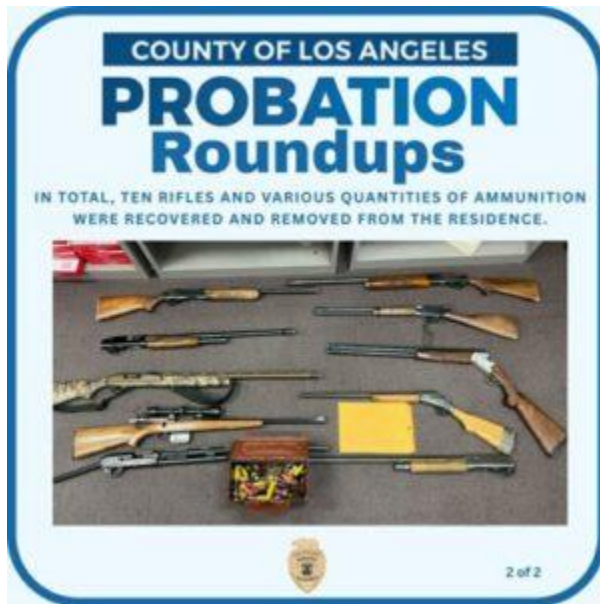
On Tuesday, February 10, 2026, members of the Los Angeles County Probation Department's Beach Cities Specialized Enforcement Operations (SEO) Team conducted a court-ordered probation search at a residence in the city of Llano.

The search was conducted to recover two outstanding rifles believed to be in the possession of a prohibited individual on summary probation. During the search, SEO officers observed numerous weapons and several safes within the residence.

The probationer and his brother were detained without incident while officers conducted a thorough search of the property. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) Palmdale Station responded to assist with filing open charges and evidence collection.



On the same day, members of the Los Angeles County Probation Department's north county specialized enforcement operations (SEO) team, along with the probation K9 unit, conducted a probation compliance check at a residence in the city of Palmdale. During the compliance check, SEO Officers observed multiple firearms in plain view inside the residence. A subsequent search of the common areas and the probationer's identified bedroom resulted in the recovery of five firearms, one of which was loaded, a baton, and approximately 1,000 rounds of ammunition. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department assisted with filing open charges and evidence collection. A probation hold was placed, and the probationer was taken into custody without incident.
