This month, LACP and LAPD South Bureau's Crime Gun Intelligence Center Unit worked together to serve a search warrant at a probationer's residence.

During the protective sweep, officers observed two AK-47s, additional firearms, and ammunition. The probationer was booked, and a hold was placed for failing to comply with probation conditions.

This operation highlights the strength of interagency collaboration in promoting accountability and enhancing community safety.

LACP Staff Complete K9 Medic Training



LACP K9 Deputy Probation Officer Robinson recently completed K9 Medic training sponsored by Iron Dog K9.

The hands-on training focused on tactical extraction and emergency medical care for an injured canine during high-risk scenarios. DPO Robinson practiced lifesaving techniques including injury assessment, airway management, and trauma treatment.

"I am proud and grateful to have participated in K9 medic training. Our dogs enter dangerous environments with us, and we have a responsibility to protect them by recognizing, treating, and managing injuries" shared DPO Robinson. "They deserve the same level of care and support we expect for ourselves."

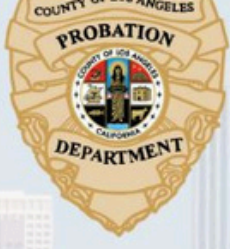
