## LOCATION FILM FEES REPORT

On November 30, 2010, on the motion of Supervisor Antonovich, your Board directed the Chief Executive Office (CEO) to prepare a comprehensive report on the total amount of fees charged to film production companies and provide a recommendation that takes into consideration the size of the production on the amount of the fee charged. On January 12, 2011, we provided your Board a status report on our efforts to work with affected County departments, your offices, and the film industry on this directive.

Since that time, we have held two constructive working meetings with representatives of the film industry, inviting their input on our draft report and recommendations. As a consequence of these meetings, we have significantly revamped our initial recommendations and made other adjustments based on their feedback. Importantly, based on a suggestion from film industry representatives, we have also agreed to coordinate semi-annual meetings between the film industry and County departments involved in filming activity to maintain open lines of communication and address any filming activity logistical issues that may arise.

Specifically, of the two main classes of fee increases initially contemplated: Use Fees for the County's Arboreta and Botanic Gardens and Vasquez Rocks, and Review Fees by the Department of Public Works (DPW), we will now be proceeding to seek your Board's approval of only the DPW Review Fees, which are based on cost recovery. We have received feedback from film industry representatives that DPW's proposed increases appear reasonable.

*"To Enrich Lives Through Effective And Caring Service"*

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As discussed below, we believe DPW's proposed increases are justified. In very limited instances, the increases are significant due to the long period of time since the last increase in 1982. However, the proposed fees are no more than they would have been had smaller increases been sought on a more regular basis. Further, as noted below, we are recommending that all County film permit fee adjustments requiring your Board's approval be addressed as a package every three years to ensure regular review and coordinated consideration of fees impacting the film industry.

This memorandum provides a summary of location film fees in the County of Los Angeles, proposals for adjustment of some fees, and as referenced above, a discussion of a coordinated process for reviewing future adjustment of fees.

### **Industry Background**

According to FilmLA, the Los Angeles Economic Development Corporation, and the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the entertainment industry is the third largest industry in the County, just behind international trade and tourism. In 2008, the entertainment industry directly employed 141,000 workers in Los Angeles County in production, post-production, distribution, and other related activities involved in creating filmed entertainment for worldwide audiences. Wages and salaries for these workers in 2008 in the County were estimated to be \$15.37 billion. In addition, for every direct job, it is estimated that 2.7 other jobs are supported by the strength of the local entertainment industry.

Given the significant impact the entertainment industry has on the County's economy, much attention has been given to the issue of runaway production. Runaway production refers to films that were conceptually developed locally, but filmed somewhere else due to lower production costs and/or local incentives. Canada passed the first filming tax incentive in 1997. In 2002, Louisiana and New Mexico became the first states to enact Canadian-style film incentives. In 2010, more than 40 states offer similar incentives. California recently launched a limited program, but budget constraints prevent it from matching the scale of other states' programs.

### **Film Permit Fees**

According to the County Code of the County of Los Angeles, a film permit is required for any filming on County property, in County facilities, and within the unincorporated areas of the County (on all private property not zoned as a film studio). In an effort to streamline the film permit process and establish a "one-stop-shop" for film permit applications, the County and City of Los Angeles jointly established the Entertainment Industry Development Corporation (now called FilmLA) in 1995.

FilmLA is a private, not-for-profit organization under contract with the County that coordinates the film permit process for on-location motion picture, television, and commercial productions. All permits for filming as described above are issued under the authority of the County. The current contract was signed in 2009 for a term of five-years (with County options to extend for two additional five-year terms).

There are a number of fees related to location film permits, many that were established in 1990, (see Attachment I which includes both current and proposed fees), which generally fall into the following four categories:

1. **FilmLA Application and Other Fees:** These fees are paid directly to FilmLA and pay for the cost of FilmLA to coordinate the permit application process, and in some cases to provide notification and monitoring services.
2. **County Use Fees:** A daily fee, or rent, is charged to use the County facility. The current fee (\$400 per day) has not been increased since 1990 (the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs charges \$125). Use Fees for the County's Arboreta and Botanic Gardens (within the Department of Parks and Recreation[P&R]) are established under separate County Code and may not exceed \$6,400 for a full day, but may include additional fees for set preparation/striking (not to exceed \$500 per day), and set standing (not to exceed \$300 per day).
3. **County Review Fees:** These fees pay for staff time (Fire Department and DPW) in providing the services necessary to review application materials, generate permit conditions, and then issue the film permit.

Both Use and Review Fees are submitted to FilmLA at the time of the application, and are then remitted to the proper County department(s). A summary of these fees for 2009-10, provided by FilmLA, is included in Attachment II. (Please note that FilmLA classifies some fees differently than the County.)

4. **County Service Fees:** Service Fees recover the cost to departments of providing support personnel during location filming (e.g. security, monitors, lifeguards, inspectors, and clean-up staff) and are paid by the film company directly to the County department(s). They are not reflected in Attachment II, which includes only fees collected by FilmLA on behalf of the County.

Please note that for filming at the County Museum of Art and Museum of Natural History, film companies must work directly with the respective nonprofit support foundations. These entities are not included with other County departments for the purposes of this report.

### **Film Permit Fee Comparison**

Attachment III provides a comparison of County film permit fees with other jurisdictions. The County charges for some fees that others do not (e. g. Fire Fuel Dispensing Truck Fee, Pyrotechnical Special Effects Fee, Flood Control Permit Fee). However, the Daily Use fees in other jurisdictions are generally much higher.

### **Proposed Film Permit Fee Increases**

Because the FilmLA Application Fee is set by the contract, we recommend no change to this fee category at this time. We should also note that waiving Use Fees as an incentive to promote location filming in the County would result in a budget shortfall for affected departments at a time when the County already faces unprecedented fiscal challenges.

### **Review Fee – Public Works**

As for the County Review Fee, the Fire Department received approval from your Board to increase some of their fees on November 30, 2010 in the amounts shown in Attachment I. DPW is also proposing increases. Existing County Code allows DPW to increase Road, but not Flood Control-related, Review Fees by CPI. This explains the large increase to the Flood Control Inspection/Monitor fee for motion and still photography DPW is proposing since it has remained at its current level since 1982. Regarding the Flood Control Issuance (a new fee) and Road Issuance fees, DPW reviewed their costs associated with processing all permit applications when establishing the amount of this fee. Consequently, the Flood Control Issuance and Road Issuance fees are required of all (film and non-film production related) applicants. The Auditor-Controller (A-C) has verified that the Public Works proposed increases are restricted to cost recovery, and public hearings before your Board must be held.

We concur with the recommendations of DPW, which are tentatively scheduled to be presented for your Board's consideration in April 2011.

Service Fees are limited to direct cost recovery and are annually reviewed by the A-C. Similar to delegated authority for CPI increases, adjustments do not require Board approval. Service Fees charged for filming activity factor in production size as larger productions require more staff time.

### **Coordinated Process for Reviewing Filming Fees**

We have worked with all the County departments that impose fees for filming on County property or in unincorporated areas and we jointly recommend that adjustments to County Use, Review and Service fees for filming be presented to your Board as a combined package every three years. This three-year interval is pegged to the triennial Fire Code review, which triggered the Fire Department fee increases which your Board approved in November 2010. Therefore, the next review of film permit fees for those fees which would require Board approval if adjusted, will be conducted in 2013, followed by 2016, etc. (Please note that any delegated CPI increases for Review Fees, or annual cost recovery reviews for Service Fees [both of which do not require Board approval] may occur annually outside this process).

Finally, as referenced above, this Office will coordinate semi-annual meetings between film industry representatives and affected County departments to address any issues and to seek a proper balance between ensuring efficient and responsive services to this important industry and protecting County interests.
