SUBJECT: SOLE SOURCE CONTRACTS ANNUAL SURVEY

Board Policy 5.100 on Sole Source Contracts requires that departments advise your Board in advance of commencing negotiations for sole source contracts in excess of \$250,000. The policy also requires departments to track their sole source contracts below the threshold of \$250,000 and to provide such information on an annual basis.

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As indicated on the attached summary document, the number of sole source contracts reported for FY 2011-12 decreased as compared to FY 2010-11.

- For FY 2011-12, seven (7) of 35 departments reported sole source contracts below the threshold of \$250,000, compared to ten (10) departments in FY 2010-11.
- For FY 2011-12, departments reported 102 County sole source contracts totaling approximately \$10.6 million, compared with 149 sole source contracts totaling \$12.5 million in FY 2010-11.

Contracts for consulting services executed under the CEO's delegated authority are not included in this report, as they are already separately reported by the CEO.

ISD will continue to report to your Board on an annual basis for sole source contracts meeting the established criteria. If you have any questions, please contact me at (323) 267-2101.
