Use up to \$15,000 in State NSP funds to be utilized pursuant to execution of the contract between the State of California and the Commission;

Accept and incorporate a grant of \$50,000 in Fannie Mae NSP funds, of which up to \$20,000 would be used for the outreach, marketing and training related to Federal and State NSP program activities under the contract with Socialserve.com;

Accept \$15,000 in City of Pasadena Partnership Funds and to incorporate up to \$5,000 into the Commission's approved Fiscal Year 2009-10 budget, with the funds to be used over a three-year period, of which \$10,000 will be used for contract fees to be paid to Socialserve.com and \$5,000 will be retained by the Commission for administrative costs;

Extending the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Emergency Contingency Fund (ECF) for one year with language which would ensure that the State and County can maintain or expand their ECF-funded subsidized employment programs;

Providing funding for a Summer Youth Employment Program with language requiring that workforce investment boards give priority to foster youth and coordinate with child welfare and Independent Living Programs;

Providing funding for the Dislocated Workers Program;

Targeting funding for infrastructure projects, such as transportation and public works in states and counties with high unemployment; and

Reauthorizing the Build America Bonds Program beyond the current

sunset date of December 31, 2010. (10-0177)

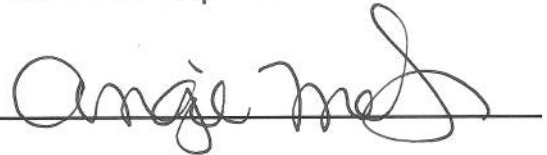
