Participation in the Child and Adult Care Food Program

For the past 13 years, the Los Angeles County (County) Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) has received grant funding from the United States Department of Agriculture (DOA) to provide a snack program in many disadvantaged communities throughout the County as part of their after-school programs. Unfortunately, the funding for the snack program is no longer available through the DOA.

However, there is another potential funding source which will allow DPR to continue to provide a snack program at many of its afterschool programs. Specifically, the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) is administered through the Department of Education and provides funding for meals and snacks at after-school programs in low-income areas. Sponsor agencies are reimbursed for meals served (according to the participant's household eligibility for free, reduced-price, or base rate meals), as well as a considerable portion of the administrative and food service labor costs. Currently, there is approximately \$532 million of funding available statewide. It is

estimated that DPR could be reimbursed \$140,000 annually for the after-school programs which would cover a majority of the costs for the snack program (see attachment for list of sites). DPR could also work with CACFP to expand this program if other locations are identified.

WE THEREFORE MOVE THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Delegate authority to the Acting Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation or his designee, as agent of the County of Los Angeles, to execute an agreement with California Department of Education's Child and Adult Care Food Program, conduct all negotiations, and submit all documents, including, but not limited to, applications, contracts, amendments, management plan and payment/reimbursement requests, which may be necessary for the ongoing implementation of the Program.
