APPROVE EXTENSION AMENDMENT TO SOLE SOURCE CONTRACT WITH MORPHOTRUST USA, INCORPORATED FOR PROVISION OF LIVESCAN EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT SERVICES (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

CIO RECOMMENDATION: APPROVE (X) APPROVE WITH MODIFICATION () DISAPPROVE ()

SUBJECT

The Los Angeles County (County) Sheriff's Department (Department) is requesting authorization from the Board to execute Amendment Number Four (Amendment) to Agreement Number 77869 (Agreement) to extend the Sole Source Contract (Contract) with MorphoTrust USA, Incorporated (MorphoTrust) for continued maintenance and support services (Services) of the Department's livescan equipment.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Approve and instruct the Chair of the Board to authorize the Sheriff to sign the attached Amendment to the Agreement with MorphoTrust to extend the term of the Agreement for one-year, plus up to 12 additional months beyond the expiration date of November 30, 2016, for continued Services of mission critical livescan equipment utilized by the Department and other law enforcement agencies within the Los Angeles County Regional Identification System (LACRIS), while the Department completes its solicitation for implementation of a replacement system.

2. Delegate authority to the Sheriff, or his designee, to exercise the extension option if it is in the best interest of the County.



PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of this action will allow the Department to complete the solicitation process that has been initiated for a new livescan capture solution.

The Amendment is necessary to ensure the livescan equipment, digital camera systems, and printers continue to operate efficiently and effectively. The Agreement provides for a contingency fund to procure additional software, hardware, and professional services on an as-needed basis, allowing the equipment to remain fully functional and up-to-date throughout the term of the Agreement.

MorphoTrust is the sole provider of Services for all livescan equipment within the County. The livescan devices are comprised exclusively of proprietary hardware and software customized to meet the needs of the Department and other LACRIS agencies. The livescan equipment, hardware, and software can only be maintained by MorphoTrust, since MorphoTrust does not license, certify, or otherwise endorse any third party to maintain or support its proprietary technology.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The Services provided under this Contract support the County's Strategic Plan, Goal 3, Integrated Services Delivery; Maximizing the opportunities to measurably improve client and community outcomes, and leverage resources through the continuous integration of public safety services.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The Department will seek approval from the Remote Access Network (RAN) Board to fund the cost of the proposed Amendment through the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) Fund (Number 41079). The expenditures for these Services are estimated to be \$1,591,761 annually, or \$132,647 monthly, at no cost to the County.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

In 2005, the County purchased 173 new livescan devices through the Internal Services Department (ISD). The devices are housed in every Sheriff's station, police station, criminal booking facility, the Coroner's Office, the District Attorney's Office, Probation Department's office, and all but two of the courthouses in the County. The livescan system is used to catalogue an average of 1,200 fingerprint enrollments per day throughout the County.

On November 25, 2008, the Board approved Sole Source Agreement Number 76819 for a term of four years with Identix, Incorporated (Identix), which expired on November 30, 2012.

On November 20, 2012, the Board approved a successor Sole Source Agreement Number 77869 with MorphoTrust (formerly Identix), which is due to expire on November 30, 2016, and is in its final option year.

The Department has engaged a consultant to work on a Request for Proposals (RFP) to purchase a replacement system. The acquisition of a replacement system will allow the Department to take advantage of new and emerging technologies that cannot be acquired within the scope of the current Agreement.

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The Agreement was amended on three prior occasions to exercise the option term extensions, add new County-mandated provisions, and memorialize the merger of Identix with MorphoTrust.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

On February 2, 2016, the Department submitted an Advance Notification of Intent to Enter into Negotiations for a Sole Source Amendment to Agreement Number 77869 with MorphoTrust USA, Incorporated, to the Board.

Extending this Agreement up to and through November 30, 2018, will allow the Department to issue the RFP.

The Chief Information Office recommends approval of the Amendment (CIO analysis attached).

The Amendment has been reviewed and approved as to form by County Counsel.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

Approval of this action will ensure continued Services of the Department's livescan equipment.



AMENDMENT NUMBER FOUR TO AGREEMENT NUMBER 77869 FOR LIVESCAN EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

This Amendment Number Four (hereinafter "Amendment") to Agreement Number 77869 (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2016 by and between County of Los Angeles (hereinafter "County") and MorphoTrust USA, Inc. (hereinafter "Contractor"), effective upon execution by both parties.

- A. WHEREAS, on November 20, 2012, County and Identix, Incorporated (hereinafter "Identix") entered into the Agreement for Livescan Equipment Maintenance and Support Services for the Initial Term of December 1, 2012 through November 30, 2014, with up to two (2) one-year Option Terms to be exercised by County by an Amendment to the Agreement pursuant to the delegated authority of County's Sheriff (hereinafter "Sheriff"); and
- B. WHEREAS, on September 4, 2013, County and Contractor entered into Amendment Number One to the Agreement to document the merger of Identix into MorphoTrust USA, Inc. (hereinafter "MorphoTrust"), with MorphoTrust surviving as "Contractor" under the Agreement; and
- C. WHEREAS, on August 8, 2014, County and Contractor entered into Amendment Number Two to the Agreement to (1) extend the Term of the Agreement by the first one-year Option Term pursuant to the delegated authority of the Sheriff and (2) add new County mandated provisions; and
- D. WHEREAS, on April 4, 2015, County and Contractor entered into Amendment Number Three to the Agreement to (1) extend the Term of the Agreement by the second one-year Option Term pursuant to the delegated authority of the Sheriff and (2) revise County mandated provisions; and
- E. WHEREAS, the Agreement will expire on November 30, 2016; and
- F. WHEREAS, County desires to extend the Term of the Agreement for an additional one-year period from December 1, 2016 through November 30, 2017, with up to 12 additional months in any increment (hereinafter, each an "Option Term").

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and for good and valuable consideration, County and Contractor hereby agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

1. The Agreement is hereby incorporated by reference, and all of its terms and conditions, including capitalized terms defined therein, shall be given full force and effect as if fully set forth herein.

2. Section 7 (Term) of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows to extend the Term of the Agreement through November 30, 2017.

7. <u>TERM</u>

- 7.1 The Term of this Agreement shall commence December 1, 2012 and shall terminate on November 30, 2014 (hereinafter "Initial Term"), unless terminated earlier in whole or in part, as provided in this Agreement.
- 7.2 County shall have the sole option to extend the Term of this Agreement for up to two (2) consecutive one-year periods (hereinafter, each an "Option Term"), for a total term not to exceed four (4) years. Each such extension shall be in the form of a written Amendment pursuant to Subparagraph 6.2.2 above.

Following execution of Amendment Number Four to the Agreement, County shall also be deemed to have extended the Term of the Agreement for up to one (1) additional one-year period through and including November 30, 2017, with an option to further extend the Term for up to twelve (12) additional months in any increment (hereinafter "Additional Term") through and including November 30, 2018. County shall be deemed to have exercised its Additional Term extension options automatically, without further act, unless County provides a thirty-day written notice that it elects not to extend the Agreement any further pursuant to this Section 7.

As used herein, "Term" shall mean and include the Initial Term, each Option Term and the Additional Term, to the extent County exercises any of its extension options pursuant to this Section 7.

- 7.3 The County maintains databases that track/monitor Contractor performance history. Information entered into such databases may be used for a variety of purposes, including determining whether County will exercise an extension option.
- 7.4 Contractor shall notify the Department when this Agreement is within six (6) months from the expiration of the Term as provided for hereinabove. Upon occurrence of this event, Contractor shall send written notification to the County Project Director at the address herein provided in Subparagraph 3.1.1 (County Project Director) of this Agreement.
- 3. Exhibit C (Maintenance Price Schedule and Equipment List) to the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced with revised Exhibit C (Maintenance Price

Schedule and Equipment List), attached hereto as Attachment 1 and incorporated herein by reference.

- 4. Except as expressly provided in this Amendment, all other terms, and conditions of the Agreement shall remain the same and in full force and effect.
- 5. Contractor represents and warrants that the person executing this Amendment for Contractor is an authorized agent who has actual authority to bind Contractor to each and every item, condition, and obligation of this Amendment and that all requirements of Contractor have been fulfilled to provide such actual authority.

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IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Amendment Number Four to be executed on its behalf by its duly authorized officers, effective as of the date first above written.

	MorphoTrust is utilized for initial booking and capturing fingerprints and mugshots and will work with in conjunction with the new MBIS system to match and identify suspects.
-	STRATEGIC AND BUSINESS ALIGNMENT:
	The proposed Amendment will allow the Department to complete the solicitation process that has been initiated for a new Live Scan capture solution. The Sheriff plans to release a Request for Proposal (RFP) in late 2016, to replace the current Live Scan System with a new Criminal Booking System (CBS). MorphoTrust fingerprint capturing system interfaces with AFIS (and ultimately with MBIS) and is strategically used for initial booking and fingerprint and mugshots. This system is a critical component of the Sheriff's overall criminal booking, investigation and law enforcement strategies, and therefore, its ongoing support and maintenance are essential to keep it functioning properly. MorphoTrust is the only vendor that can provide those services.
	PROJECT APPROACH:
	MorphoTrust is the sole provider of maintenance and support services for its customized digital fingerprinting system. This amended Agreement allows the Sheriff's Department to continue to receive uninterrupted maintenance and

support services of the system for the Department's LACRIS Unit.

	ALTERNATIVES ANALYZED: MorphoTrust was selected via a competitive bid process in 2005. The propos Amendment will also allow the Department to complete the solicitation proce that has been initiated for a new Live Scan capture solution.

Technical Analysis	ANALYSIS OF PROPOSED IT SOLUTION:				
	The Live Scan fingerprinting System runs on Microsoft Windows, SQL Server, advanced user and group rights management, including additional security features, to maintain the integrity of the database. Live Scan runs at the Sheriff's data center with a redundant database, utilizing an SQL database to assure immediate, fault-tolerant, continuous operation through back-up, sharing, and separation security. The Live Scan Administration Module enables administrators to maintain security access rights, customize the system's screens and fields, and track user activity. The technology being employed by MorphoTrust is consistent with the industry standards and the County CIO initiatives.
