Under the post 9/11 GI Bill, only those National Guard members who serve on a federal mission (such as in Iraq or Afghanistan) are eligible for higher education benefits, leaving thousands of California National Guard members who serve closer to home without such benefits. California is currently the only state in the nation that has yet to close this gap and offer a higher education incentive to reward and retain its citizen soldiers.

Senate Bill 815 (Cogdill) will establish the California National Guard (CNG)

Education Assistance Program, making available \$3.6 million to help approximately

1,300 guard members pay tuition and some fees at California's universities and

community colleges. To qualify for this benefit, a CNG member would be required to be:

a California resident and a two-year active member of the CNG, State Military Reserve

or the Naval Militia.
