DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS: ATHENS PARK COMMUNITY CENTER REFURBISHMENT ATHENS VILLAGE AREA APPROVE PROJECT BUDGET SPECS. 7023; CAPITAL PROJECT NO. 86983 (SECOND DISTRICT) (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

This action is to approve the project budget for the Athens Park Community Center project, and authorize the Director of Public Works to carry out the project through a Board-approved Job Order Contract (JOC).

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Approve the \$920,000 project budget for the Athens Park Community Center Refurbishment project, Capital Project No. 86983.
- 2. Authorize the Director of Public Works to deliver the Athens Park Community Center project using a Board-approved Job Order Contract.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will authorize the Department of Public Works (Public Works) to deliver the refurbishment of the facility at the Athens Park located at 12603 South Broadway, Los Angeles, California 90061, using a Board-approved JOC.

The Community Center at Athens Park is in need of refurbishment due to its advanced age and deterioration due to use. The existing restrooms will be upgraded to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and the deteriorated interior cabinets, desks, shelves, floors, and wall finishes will be replaced or painted. The exterior will be cleaned and painted; the tile roofing will be refurbished; damaged rafters will be repaired; the ventilation and heating system will be replaced; and damaged lighting, windows, doors and path of travel will be replaced or refurbished.

Approval of the recommendation will authorize Public Works to proceed with the refurbishment project using a Board-approved JOC.

Sustainable Design Program

The project supports your Board's Sustainable Design Program by installing energy efficient lighting and by increasing the efficiency of the heating system.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The Countywide Strategic Plan directs the provision of Operational Effectiveness (Goal 1) by improving the efficiency, quality, and responsiveness of County services to all residents. It also directs that we ensure Children, Family and Adult Well-Being (Goal 2) by enhancing the ability of families to live in safe, stable, and supportive communities. We are also directed to improve Community and Municipal Services (Goal 3) by offering a wide range of services responsive to each community's specific needs. The project will benefit the community and makes recreational services available to the youth of the area.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

On June 16, 2008, your Board established the project and allocated \$450,000 for the project budget. Based on the validated and revised scope of work and a third-party cost estimate, the current project cost estimate is \$920,000, including preparation of the plans and specifications, plan check fees, consultant services, miscellaneous expenditures, Civic Art allocation, construction costs, change orders, JOC costs, and County services. Sufficient funds have been budgeted in the 2009-10 Capital Projects Budget for the Athens Park Community Center project, Capital Project No. 86983.

The Project Schedule and Budget Summary are included in Attachment A. The project is funded in the 2009-10 Capital Projects Budget with \$920,000 of Second District Capital Project net County cost.

Operational Budget Impact

The Department of Parks and Recreation (Parks and Recreation) does not anticipate any one-time, start-up or ongoing costs resulting from the recommended actions. The project provisions have maintenance requirements that will be fulfilled with existing park staff and resources.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Program validation services have been procured from Tetra Design through a previously Board-approved, as-needed consultant contract.

Design services have been procured from J.C. Chang and Associates through a previously Board-approved, as-needed consultant contract.

All demolition, site work, and refurbishment work will be carried out by a previously Board-approved JOC.

In order to increase participation of qualified local residents in areas where projects are being implemented by the County via JOC, a local worker hiring program has been incorporated into the County's JOC procurement. The program's objective is intended to give work opportunities to qualified local residents where projects are being developed. Except where State or Federal laws or regulations mandate to the contrary, these provisions will apply to all eligible JOCs.

As required by your Board, the project cost includes 1 percent of design and construction costs to be allocated to the Civic Art Fund per your Boards Civic Art Policy adopted on December 7, 2004.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

On June 16, 2008, your Board found the proposed project to be categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15302, Replacement and Reconstruction, Class 2 (c), and the County of Los Angeles Environmental Procedures and Guidelines, Appendix G, Class 2 (e), adopted by your Board on November 17, 1987, because the project provides for minor alterations of existing facilities, involving negligible or no expansion of an existing use, installation of new accessory structures, minor grading, and landscaping. A Notice of Exemption was filed with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The project will be constructed under a Board-approved JOC.

The architect/engineer, J.C. Chang and Associates, was approved by your Board on July 1, 2008, to provide as-needed architect/engineer design services for various County projects for a three-year term.

Tetra Design, an architect/engineer firm that provided program validation services for this project, was approved by your Board on November 11, 2006, to provide as-needed architect/engineer design services for various County projects for a three-year term.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES OR PROJECTS

There will be no negative impact on current County services or projects during the performance of the recommended services.
