


## ANALYSIS

This ordinance amends Title 3 – Advisory Commissions and Committees, of the Los Angeles County Code by repealing Chapters 3.06 and 3.40 in their entirety and thereby discontinues the Commission on Alcoholism and the Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Commission, respectively. The ordinance also creates Chapter 3.15, relating to the Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs.

**ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_**

An ordinance amending Title 3 – Advisory Commissions and Committees of the Los Angeles County Code, to repeal Chapters 3.06 and 3.40 relating to the Commission on Alcoholism and the Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Commission, and to create Chapter 3.15 relating to the Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles ordains as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 3.06, the Commission on Alcoholism, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

**SECTION 2.** Chapter 3.15 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15 COMMISSION ON ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS**

**SECTION 3.** Section 3.15.010 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.010 Created.**

There is hereby created the commission on alcohol and other drugs, hereinafter referred to in this chapter as the "commission," pursuant to State of California Health and Safety Code sections 429.997, 11752.1(e), 11798.1(a), 11805, 11998.1(f)(2).

**SECTION 4.** Section 3.15.020 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.020 Members – Nomination and appointment.**

A. Members of the commission shall have a professional interest in, or personal commitment to, alleviating problems related to alcohol and other drug abuse in their community. The membership shall include representatives from various economic, social and occupational groups, shall be broadly representative of the demographic

characteristics of the County, and, to the extent possible, shall be geographically balanced. No more than forty-nine (49) percent of the total composition of the commission may be from an organization providing alcohol and other drug prevention, treatment or recovery services, hereafter referred to in this chapter as a "provider." Only members of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, hereafter referred to in this chapter as the "board," may nominate a provider.

B. The commission shall consist of nineteen (19) members composed and appointed as follows:

1. Each member of the board shall nominate three (3) members.
2. The County's alcohol and drug program administration shall nominate one (1) member who is representative of education. The member shall be actively employed in the field of education.
3. The Countywide Criminal Justice Coordination Committee shall nominate one (1) member who is representative of a public safety agency.
4. The mayor of the City of Los Angeles shall nominate one (1) member who is representative of the City of Los Angeles. For purposes of this section 3.15.020(B)(4), a member shall be considered "representative of the City of Los Angeles" if the member demonstrates an understanding of alcohol and other drug abuse issues and how those issues impact residents of the City of Los Angeles.

5. The president of the Los Angeles County division of the League of California Cities shall nominate one (1) member who is representative of the inter-governmental perspective on alcohol and other drug abuse issues. For purposes of this section 3.15.020(B)(5), a member shall be considered "representative of the inter-governmental perspective on alcohol and drug abuse issues" if the member demonstrates an understanding of alcohol and other drug abuse issues and how those issues impact residents of the greater Los Angeles region.

6. The commission shall not include any person or his or her spouse who is any of the following:

a. A member of the board or a person on the staff of a member of the board;

b. A county employee of the health-related agency or department with which the alcohol and drug program administrator may be affiliated.

7. All nominations made pursuant to this section 3.15.020 shall be affirmed by the board.

**SECTION 5.** Section 3.15.030 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.030 Terms of Service.**

All members of the commission shall serve at the pleasure of the board. At the first regular meeting of the commission after January 1, 2010, the members shall so classify themselves by lot that the term of six (6) members will expire on January 1, 2011, the term of six (6) members shall expire on January 1, 2012, and the term of

seven (7) members shall expire January 1, 2013. Thereafter, each member of the commission shall serve for a term of three (3) years.

**SECTION 6.** Section 3.15.040 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.040 Vacancies.**

Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the board with the appointee serving for the remainder of the unexpired term. The tenure of each member is also subject to the provisions of Section 5.12.050 of this code.

**SECTION 7.** Section 3.15.050 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.050 Duties.**

The commission shall advise and make recommendations to the board on alcohol and other drug issues with the goal of reducing problems and the negative impact of alcohol and other drug use on the quality of life in the Los Angeles County.

**SECTION 8.** Section 3.15.060 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.060 Meetings.**

The commission shall meet once per month and may meet at such other times as may be deemed necessary by the chair of the commission or the alcohol and drug program administrator.

**SECTION 9.** Section 3.15.070 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.070 Compensation.**

Each member of the commission shall receive as compensation for each meeting attended by said person the sum of twenty-five (\$25) dollars not to exceed fifty (\$50) dollars in any month.

**SECTION 10.** Section 3.15.080 is hereby added to read as follows:

**3.15.080 Expense Reimbursement.**

Each member of the commission shall be reimbursed for the member's actual and necessary traveling expenses when the member is required to travel in the performance of the duties set forth in this chapter, including transportation, meals and lodging, in accordance with the provision of Ordinance 4099.

**SECTION 11.** Chapter 3.40, Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Commission, is hereby repealed in its entirety.
