APPROVE THE ACCEPTANCE OF GRANT FUNDS FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY AND UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY FISCAL YEAR 2009 STAFFING FOR ADEQUATE FIRE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE GRANT (ALL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

#### **SUBJECT**

The Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County (Fire District) is requesting approval to accept \$3.554 million in grant funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Fiscal Year 2009 (FY 09) Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant (Grant Number EMW-2009-FH-01070).

### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD ACTING AS THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CONSOLIDATED FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY:

- 1. Accept \$3.554 million in grant funding, from the FY 09 SAFER Grant (Grant Number EMW-2009-FH-01070) (see attachment). The grant will provide funding for the Fire District to refill nine firefighter positions that will allow for the restoration of Engine 167 in the City of El Monte.
- 2. Authorize the Fire Chief, or his designee, to implement the project as described herein, including executing grant agreements with the FEMA and United States DHS and any amendments, including extensions of time, minor changes in project scope, and alterations in the project budget or grant amount subject to approval of such documents by County Counsel, and authorizing requests for reimbursement.

#### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

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The City of El Monte contracts with the Fire District to provide fire protection and emergency medical services. As a budget reduction measure, the City took action to close Fire Station 167 effective September 1, 2009, reducing fire protection services by 25 percent in the City of El Monte. Acceptance of \$3.554 million through the FY 09 SAFER Grant Program will provide salary and employee benefits for two years to reopen Fire Station 167 in the City of El Monte effective Friday, September 3, 2010.

As stipulated in their Agreement for Services contract, the City of El Monte is billed annually by the Fire District for the salary, employee benefits, and all associated overhead costs for the personnel assigned to fire stations within the City. Because the FY 09 SAFER Grant does not include overhead costs as an eligible expenditure for Engine 167, the City of El Monte has agreed to incur the annual \$580,000 cost and will ensure sufficient funding is included in their 2010-11 and 2011-12 budgets.

It will be the City of El Monte's financial responsibility to sustain Engine 167 beyond the FY 09 SAFER Grant two-year period of performance.

#### <u>Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals</u>

Approval of the recommended actions are consistent with the County's Strategic Plan Goal Number 1, Operational Effectiveness, through emergency preparedness and response efforts; and Goal Number 5, Public Safety, by maintaining and improving the highest level of safety and security standards for the residents of Los Angeles County by providing for an ongoing improved level of fire protection, emergency medical, and other life safety services to the City of El Monte, adjacent communities, and adding to the resources available for automatic/mutual aid services requests throughout the Fire District's jurisdiction.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING**

The City of El Monte has agreed to incur the annual \$580,000 overhead costs that are not funded through the SAFER Grant and will ensure sufficient funding is included in their 2010-11 and 2011-12 budgets. The positions for Fire Station 167 are included in the Fire District's budget.

There is no impact on net County cost.

#### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The FEMA and United States DHS have provided the Fire District with guidelines for the administration of the grant agreement. These guidelines detail the activities and expenditures that are allowable for reimbursement. The performance period for the FY 09 SAFER Grant is July 15, 2010 through July 14, 2012.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

The recommended actions are not subject to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act. They will not result in a direct or reasonable foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment in accordance with Section 15061(b)(3) of the State of California Environmental Quality

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Act guidelines.

#### **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

Approval of the recommended actions will ensure the Fire District's ability to provide effective and essential levels of public safety to the residents of Los Angeles County, as well as expand the quality and productivity of emergency services.

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#### Article I - Project Description

The purpose of the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response program is to provide funding directly to fire departments and volunteer firefighter interest organizations in order to help them increase the number of trained, "front-line" firefighters available in their communities.
