## AMENDMENT TO AGENDA ITEM #3 (ARCADIA PARK POOL)

On August 24, the Director of Parks and Recreation and the Director of Public Health provided a joint report to the Board on their assessment of the July 19 chlorination incident at the Arcadia Park County pool, as well as their findings on chlorination procedures at our other County-operated pools. The report includes a number of recommended corrective actions to ensure that a similar incident does not occur at the Arcadia site or our other County pools.

The report indicates that a number of corrective measures related to the Arcadia pool are being included in the planned construction of a new pool, because it would not be fiscally prudent to make the corrections in the existing pool given the short time remaining in the pool season. The cost of these repairs is estimated to be \$80,000. This plan is based on the assumption that demolition work and construction would begin in the next few months. However, the Chief Executive Officer recently reported that demolition and construction activities will not begin until late 2011, with completion expected in June 2013.

- 2. The Director of Parks and Recreation to provide a work plan and detailed timeline for completing these repairs;
- 3. The Chief Executive Officer to provide a work plan and schedule for demolition and construction work related to the replacement pool at the Arcadia Park; and
- 4. The Chief Executive Officer and Director of Parks and Recreation to report back on the funding and installation plan for the automatic chemical metering systems needed at the nine remaining County pools that currently use manual systems.

The requested reports should be provided in 30 days.
