## Reward Offer for Mr. Hanna Morcos

On Friday September 24, 2010, between 3:40 p.m. and 4:30 p.m., Hanna Morcos, an 80-year old man, was assaulted and killed at his home located in the 4100 block of West 137<sup>th</sup> Street in the City of Hawthorne. The suspect is a male who was seen wearing a white shirt and dark pants. The suspect came to the front door and entered the home. The suspect committed a home invasion robbery and assaulted and killed Mr. Morcos. Several items were stolen from the residence. Mr. Morcos' wife was in the house when the murder took place, but was not injured.

Hanna Morcos was a retired employee for the County of Los Angeles, where he worked for the Treasurer-Tax Collector's office. He began his career in 1977, and retired in 2003. He is survived by his wife of 48 years, three daughters, and several grandchildren.

The Los Angeles Sheriff's Department investigators believe there are witnesses that may have seen the suspect entering or leaving the victim's home, and they urge
