- 1 THINK IS ANTICIPATED NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS THAT HAVE COME TO
- 2 US, THE PAROLE SYSTEM, THE JAIL SYSTEM, SO ON, THAT WE GET THE
- 3 RIGHT PROPORTIONATE SHARE AND WE DON'T GET A SMALL COUNTY LIKE
- 4 PLACID COUNTY GETTING, YOU KNOW, AN AMOUNT THAT'S MUCH MORE.
- 5 BUT I AGREE, THIS IS NOT-- THIS IS A TIME FOR ALL OF US TO
- 6 WORK TOGETHER, BUT HAVING AND PROVIDING A PACKAGE OF NOT
- 7 COMPLAINTS BUT A PACKAGE OF PROPOSALS TO OUR DELEGATION WOULD
- 8 BE VERY POWERFUL, IF WE CAN DO THAT AS A COUNTY. SO THAT'S WHY
- 9 THE MEETING IS A VERY, VERY GOOD IDEA, BUT AGAIN, I AGREE,
- 10 THIS IS NOT THE TIME FOR COMPLAINTS, BUT THE TIME TO OFFER
- 11 SOLUTIONS.

- 13 SUP. MOLINA: THE PACKAGES, YEAH. C.E.O. FUJIOKA: YEAH WE'RE
- 14 WORKING ON IT RIGHT NOW.

- 16 SUP. MOLINA: I KNOW, BUT I KNOW THAT SOMEBODY IS PLANNING A
- 17 MEETING ON FRIDAY AND I'M SITTING THERE SAYING, "WHAT ARE WE
- 18 GOING TO TELL THEM?" WE NEED TO HAVE A PACKAGE IN PLACE.

- 20 SUP. ANTONOVICH, MAYOR: I THINK WHERE THE GOVERNOR FAILED
- 21 RELATIVE TO THE TAX INCREASE, HE WOULD HAVE HAD A MORE
- 22 RECEPTIVE RESPONSE TO EXTENDING TEMPORARY TAXES IF HE'D HAD A
- 23 COMPREHENSIVE RESTRUCTURING GOING ALONG ALL LEVELS,
- 24 STRUCTURING THE WAY THEY DELIVER SERVICES, HAVING THAT AS PART
- 25 OF HIS REFORM INSTEAD OF BASICALLY SAYING, "WE'RE GOING TO

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- 1 SHIFT THIS TO LOCALS AND TAX WILL FUND THOSE LOCAL MANDATED
- 2 PROGRAMS," WHEN WE KNOW THAT THE HISTORY OF THE STATE IS NOT
- 3 TO PROVIDE ANY TYPE OF OPPORTUNITIES FOR US TO HAVE FULL
- 4 FUNDING FOR THOSE MANDATED SERVICES. THAT'S WHAT WE'RE TALKING
- 5 ABOUT.

- 7 SUP. MOLINA: I THINK WE CAN DO THAT. IF WE WANT TO SHARE WITH
- 8 HIM HOW WE WANT TO CHANGE THE STRUCTURE, I THINK HE WOULD BE
- 9 RECEPTIVE TO IT. THERE'S NOTHING WRONG-- I DON'T THINK HE'S
- 10 THE ONLY MAN OF IDEA IN THIS STATE. WE CAN OFFER THEM-- IT'S A
- 11 TIME OF HOW WE COULD POTENTIALLY DELIVER THOSE SERVICES MAYBE
- 12 DIFFERENTLY, AND OF COURSE I THINK WE NEED TO LET THEM KNOW
- 13 HOW MUCH MONEY WE NEED ON ALL OF THESE THINGS, BUT YOU CAN'T
- 14 JUST GO IN THERE AND SAY, "NOT US. EVERYBODY BUT US."

- 16 SUP. ANTONOVICH, MAYOR: AND YOU'RE ABSOLUTELY RIGHT. WE HAVE
- 17 TO SHOW HIM, THE STATE, HOW WE CAN DELIVER A SYSTEM MORE COST
- 18 EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVELY AND THOSE TYPES OF REFORMS HAVE TO
- 19 BE A PART OF ANY FUTURE SPENDING PROPOSALS THAT ARE COMING
- 20 FORTH. BUT RIGHT NOW, I AGREE, JUST CAN'T SAY, "WE'RE GOING TO
- 21 ELIMINATE 10,000 PEOPLE HERE, 20,000 PEOPLE THERE, WHEN
- 22 PERHAPS WE COULD ENHANCE THOSE SERVICES AND DELIVERIES AT A
- 23 MUCH CHEAPER RATE DELIVERING THAT SAME PROGRAM, BUT WE NEED TO
- 24 HAVE SOME OF THE TYPES OF REFORMS THAT THE STATE WILL ALLOW US
- 25 TO HAVE OR GIVE US 100 PERCENT FLEXIBILITY, WHICH THEY DON'T

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- 1 AND HAVEN'T DONE IN THEIR PROPOSAL BEFORE US. I WOULD LIKE TO
- 2 HAVE A LIST OF THE NON MANDATED CUTS, THE NON MANDATED
- 3 SERVICES THAT WE PROVIDE, HOW THOSE CUTS ARE GOING TO IMPACT
- 4 THOSE. SUPERVISOR KNABE.

- 6 SUP. KNABE: AGAIN, WE JUST NEED TO BE AT THE TABLE, THAT'S MY
- 7 POINT, TO BE A PARTNER IN ALL THIS. I'M NOT ADVOCATING JUST TO
- 8 COMPLAIN. I'M SAYING, "HERE ARE SOME POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS." AND
- 9 WHEN YOU TALK ABOUT CALWORKS, YOU KNOW, THAT'S WHAT THE
- 10 COUNTIES DO BUT THE STATE'S TAKING A THIRD OF THE
- 11 ADMINISTRATIVE COST PRACTICALLY OFF THE TOP AND WE DO ALL THE
- 12 WORK, NOT JUST L.A. COUNTY, BUT ALL COUNTIES. SO THERE'S
- 13 OPPORTUNITIES IN REALIGNMENT THAT WE DO THAT SERVICE, AND I
- 14 REMIND EVERYONE, WHAT'S IRONIC ABOUT ALL OF THIS, THESE ARE
- 15 COUNTY OPERATED PROGRAMS, NOT COUNTY MANDATED PROGRAMS OR
- 16 MANDATED BY THE STATE AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. SAME PEOPLE
- 17 CUTTING US ARE THE SAME PEOPLE SAYING, "COUNTIES, YOU DO THIS
- 18 WORK." AND SO IN MANY CASES, I MEAN, OBVIOUSLY WE HAVE OUR
- 19 ISSUES, WE DO IT MORE EFFICIENTLY THAN ANYONE ELSE AND AT THE
- 20 END OF THE DAY WHERE THE RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD, WE'VE GOT THE
- 21 CONSUMER OR THE CONSTITUENT INTO OFFICE, NOT JUST OURS, BUT
- 22 SOCIAL SERVICES WORKER, AND THE STATE'S UP THERE ADMINISTERING
- 23 THINGS, OR IF WE NEED SOME HELP, SET IT UP, SOMEBODY'S ON
- 24 VACATION KIND OF THING, WE DON'T GET AN ANSWER BACK, BUT YET
- 25 IT'S THE CONSTITUENT, IT'S THE ULTIMATE CONSUMER THAT SUFFERS
