SUBJECT: POSTPONEMENT OF THE 2011 ANNUAL RUN FOR HEALTH

On April 11, 2011, the Los Angeles County Commission for Women (Commission) voted not to host the 2011 Annual Run for Health. The decision was very difficult for the Commission, but necessary due to the lack of major sponsors, increasing production costs, and a continuing trend of declining participants.

The Commission relied on proceeds from this annual event to fund its Girls-At-Risk scholarship program. Please be assured that the Commission is in the process of exploring other avenues to raise funds in order to continue providing these young women with educational scholarships. In March of this year, a portion of proceeds from Women of the Year Awards Luncheon was allocated to support the scholarship program. However, the allocated funds from the Luncheon will not allow the Commission to match its 30 scholarships awarded in 2011.

Therefore, the Commission is requesting each Board office contribute \$5,000 to enable the Commission to award scholarships. Please keep in mind when considering our request, that the scholarship recipients are young women who have had to overcome numerous hardships at very young ages and your contributions will aid them in graduating from various colleges such as Mount St. Mary's, University of Southern California, University of California Los Angeles, and Cal-State Los Angeles, Long Beach and Northridge.
