STREET LIGHTING DISTRICTS ANNEXATION AND LEVYING OF ASSESSMENTS FOR COUNTY LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICTS 1687, 1697, AND 10006 AND COUNTY LIGHTING DISTRICT LLA-1 (UNINCORPORATED, CARSON, AND DIAMOND BAR ZONES); FORMATION OF IMPROVEMENT ZONE 548 FOR PETITION NO. 107-707; AND NEGOTIATED EXCHANGE OF PROPERTY TAX REVENUES, PETITION NOS. 6-107, 23-307, 25-307, 27-307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, 111-1108, 113-1108, 14-309, 62-608, 182-1107, AND 107-707 UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF ROWLAND HEIGHTS, VALINDA, CHARTER OAK, SOUTH WHITTIER, AND SOUTH SAN GABRIEL, AND THE CITIES OF CARSON AND DIAMOND BAR (SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS 1, 2, AND 4) (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

This action is to proceed with the annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, 1697, and 10006 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones), respectively; formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707; approval of a loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 548 to finance the estimated \$30,000 cost of installing a street lighting system; and the levying of assessments on benefited properties within these territories for the installation, operation, and maintenance of street lighting facilities within the annexed territories.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

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1. Find that the proposed project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act for the reasons stated in this letter and in the record of the project.

2. Approve the Engineer's Reports for Petition Nos. 6-107, 23-307, 25-307, 27 307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, 111-1108, 113-1108, 14-309, 62-608, 182-1107, and 107-707, either as filed or as modified, for the annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance Districts 1687, 1697, and 10006 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones); formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707; and levying of assessments within the annexed territories for street lighting purposes. The proposed annexation areas are located in the unincorporated communities of Rowland Heights, Valinda, Charter Oak, South Whittier, South San Gabriel, and in the Cities of Carson and Diamond Bar.

3. Adopt the resolution of intention to annex territories to County Lighting Maintenance Districts 1687, 1697, and 10006 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones); Order Formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707; Order the Levying of a Special Assessment in Improvement Zone 548 for Fiscal Year 2012-13; and Order the Levying of Assessments within the Annexed Territories for Fiscal Year 2012-13.

4. Set a date for a public hearing regarding the proposed annexations, formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707, and levying of annual assessments within the annexed territories for street lighting purposes with a base assessment rate for a single-family residence of \$5, \$1, and \$13 for the Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones of County Lighting District LLA-1, respectively; approval of a loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 548 for the cost of installing the street lights in an amount currently estimated to be \$30,000; and approval and levying of a special annual assessment currently estimated to be \$146 per parcel per year for 10 years beginning in Fiscal Year 2012-13 against benefited properties to repay the loan.

5. Instruct the Executive Officer of your Board to cause notice of the public hearing by mail at least 45 days prior to the scheduled public hearing date of Tuesday, <u>Werney 22, 201</u>, pursuant to section 53753 of the California Government Code. The mailed notice will include assessment ballots.

6. Instruct the Executive Officer of your Board to cause notice of the public hearing to be posted in three conspicuous places within the territories to be annexed and to publish the notice of public hearing once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation. Such posting and publication to be completed at least 10 days prior to the date of hearing, pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code section 5838.

AFTER THE PUBLIC HEARING, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Find that the annexations and assessments are for the purpose of meeting operating expenses; purchasing supplies, equipment, or materials; meeting financial reserve needs and requirements; and obtaining funds for capital projects, including the installation, operation, and maintenance of street lights necessary to maintain service within the areas proposed for annexation.

2. Order changes, if needed, in any of the matters provided in the Engineer's Reports, including changes in the improvements, the proposed diagrams, or the proposed assessments.

3. Order the tabulation of assessment ballots submitted, and not withdrawn, in support of or opposition to the proposed assessment.

4. Determine whether a majority protest against the proposed annexations or assessments exists.

5. Make a finding terminating the annexation, the formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707, levying of assessments and property tax transfer proceedings in those petition territories where there has been a majority protest to the assessments, and refer the matter back to the Department of Public Works.

6. If there is no majority protest against the proposed assessments, adopt the resolution ordering annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance Districts 1687, 1697, and 10006 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones), ordering formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707, confirming a diagram and assessment, and levying of assessments within the annexed territories for Fiscal Year 2012-13, either as proposed or as modified by your Board. The adoption of the resolution ordering annexation shall constitute the levying of assessments in Fiscal Year 2012-13.

7. Approve a loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707 for the cost of installing six street lights on concrete poles in an amount currently estimated to be \$30,000. The actual cost for installation plus interest will be assessed over a 10-year period from Fiscal Year 2012-13 through Fiscal Year 2021-22 in equal payments of approximately \$146 per parcel per year for each of the 22 benefited parcels located therein.

8. Instruct the Director of Public Works or her designee to proceed with the installation of six street lights on concrete poles with overhead wiring within Improvement Zone 548.

9. Adopt the joint resolutions between your Board and other taxing agencies approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues resulting from the annexation of these territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 as approved by the nonexempt taxing agencies.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The purpose of the recommended action is to: (1) find that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environment Quality Act (CEQA); (2) annex the territories known as Petition Nos. 6-107 (Greenbay Drive), 23-307 (Amar Road, et al.), 25-307 (Nogales Street), 27-307 (California Avenue), 28-307 (Temple Avenue, et al.), 30-307 (Vineland Avenue), 130-907 (Holton Street), 111-1108 (Foxworth Avenue), 113-1108 (Traymore Avenue), 14-309 (Laurel Avenue), and 107-707 (High Pine Street) to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone); Petition No. 62-608 to CLMD 1697 and CLD LLA-1 (Carson Zone); and Petition No. 182-1107 to CLMD 10006 and CLD LLA-1 (Diamond Bar Zone); (3) form Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707 for the purposes of financing the installation of street lights on concrete poles; (4) levy a special assessment for Fiscal Year (FY) 2012-13 on the benefited parcels within Improvement Zone 548, (5) levy assessments for FY 2012-13 on the benefited properties within the annexed territories for street lighting purposes; and (6) approve the exchange of property tax revenues among those nonexempt agencies whose service areas are subject to the jurisdictional change.

The installation of street lights on concrete poles is subject to installation charges. Per the California

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Streets and Highways Code, your Board can provide for a temporary advance to an improvement fund and direct that the advance be repaid by a special assessment levied and collected in annual installments. The formation of Improvement Zone 548 will provide for the financing of the estimated \$30,000 cost to install six street lights on concrete poles with overhead wiring within Petition No. 107 -707.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

The Countywide Strategic Plan directs the provision of Operational Effectiveness (Goal 1). The Department of Public Works (Public Works) ensures the fiscal sustainability of street lighting services by performing the annexation, formation of Improvement Zone 548, levying of assessments, and property tax transfer to provide the funding necessary for the installation, operation and maintenance of new street lighting facilities within these annexed territories. In addition, this action is consistent with Community and Municipal Services (Goal 3) since street lighting services provides for the delivery of a customer-oriented municipal service that improves the quality of life for residents in the area.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Sufficient funds are included in the FY 2011-12 Budget for CLMDs 1687, 1697, and 10006 and CLD LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones) to fund the costs for the operation and maintenance of the street lights within these petition areas, should annual operation and maintenance charges estimated at \$17,297; \$647; and \$820, respectively, be incurred prior to the end of FY 2011-12. Funds to finance future operational costs will be made available through the Public Works' annual budget process.

Upon your Board's approval, CLMD 1687 will finance installation of street lights in Improvement Zone 548 with a loan of funds to be repaid by a special assessment on the property owners in Improvement Zone 548. The loan is currently estimated to be \$30,000 and will be repaid over a 10-year period beginning in FY 2012-13 and ending in FY 2021-22. Repayment will include interest computed based on the County's pooled surplus investment fund restricted interest rate; the annual payment amount per parcel is shown on the Amortization Schedule attached to the Engineer's Report for Petition No.107-707 (Improvement Zone 548). The special assessment will be levied by CLD LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone) and transferred to CLMD 1687.

In subsequent years, the ongoing operation and maintenance costs of the street lights within the annexed territories will be funded by the CLMD's share of ad valorem property taxes, supplemented by assessments annually approved by your Board from property owners within these annexed territories. The proposed annexations will result in a minimal property tax growth transfer from the affected taxing entities, including the Los Angeles County General Fund; Los Angeles County Library; Los Angeles County Special Road Maintenance Districts 1, 2, and 4; Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County; and Los Angeles County Flood Control District to CLMDs 1687, 1697, and 10006.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Your Board previously approved and filed Petition Nos. 6-107, 23-307, 25-307, 27-307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, 111-1108, 113-1108, 14-309, 62-608, 182-1107, and 107 707; adopted a resolution

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initiating proceedings for the annexation of territories to CLMDs 1687, 1697, and 10006 and CLD LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones); formation Improvement Zone 548 for Petition 107-707; ordered the Director of Public Works or her designee to prepare and file an Engineer's Report for each petitioned territory. The enclosed Engineer's Reports were prepared in response to that directive.

Temporary advances to finance improvements and assessments to repay the advances are authorized by the California Streets and Highways Code sections 22657 and 22660. At the time Petition No. 107-707 (Improvement Zone 548) was initiated, the County's pooled surplus investment fund restricted interest rate was 5.266 percent, which resulted in an estimated annual payment of \$179 per parcel for a 10-year period as reflected in Petition No. 107-707. The 6-month average of the County's pooled surplus investment fund restricted interest rate is currently computed to be 1.321 percent. Thus, the special assessment is currently estimated to be \$146 per parcel per year, collected from the owners of the 22 parcels in Improvement Zone 548, over a 10-year period from FY 2012-13 through FY 2021-22.

The Puente Hills Community Enhancement and Benefit Fund will finance the estimated \$285,000 cost for the installation of street lights on concrete poles with overhead wiring for Petition Nos. 25-307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, and 111-1108. The First Supervisorial Districts' allocation of Proposition 62 monies will fund the estimated \$90,000 costs for the installation of street lights on concrete poles with underground wiring for Petition Nos. 6-107 and 14-309.

Under California Government Code section 53753, it is necessary to follow the procedures for levying of assessments previously authorized by your Board, including the distribution, receipt, and tabulation of ballots at a public hearing. Ballots will be mailed to each property owner within the annexation territories. The assessment will only be levied if the weighted majority of ballots returned are in favor of the assessment.

The enclosed resolution of intention must be adopted to set a date for the required public hearing. Your Board, at the close of the public hearing, may delay its determination regarding the annexations and levying of assessments until a later date, continue the public hearing to receive further testimony, or make a determination regarding the annexation and assessment.

California Revenue and Taxation Code section 99.01 (a)(4) provides that affected agencies must approve and accept the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues by resolution. The joint resolutions approving and accepting the exchange of property tax revenues have been approved by nonexempt taxing agencies and are enclosed for your consideration.

The boundaries of the proposed annexations have been reviewed and approved by Public Works and the County Assessor in accordance with the requirements of the California Government Code section 58850 et seq. and are on file with Public Works. A copy of the diagram showing the boundaries of each proposed annexation area is attached to the Engineer's Report prepared for each petitioned area. Following your Board's approval of the resolution for the annexations, levying of assessments, and exchange of property tax revenues, Public Works will file with the State Board of Equalization the statement of boundary changes as required by the California Government Code section 54900 et seq.

The enclosed resolutions have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The proposed actions are categorically exempt from the provisions of the CEQA. The project to annex territory to the County Lighting Districts for the purpose of enhancing street lighting is within a class of projects that have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment in that it meets the criteria set forth in Section 15301(c) of the CEQA Guidelines and Class 1(x)(27) of the County's Environmental Document Reporting Procedures and Guidelines, Appendix G, which specifically includes annexations to street lighting districts and installation of street lights and involves no expansion of use. In addition, there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, or other limiting factors that would make the exemption inapplicable based on the project records.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

The annexation of territories to CLDs will result in street lighting for these areas and will have no impact on other services or projects.

On April 3, 2007, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors adopted a Resolution Initiating Proceedings for the annexation of territory to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone), pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, for the purpose of providing for the cost of installing, operating, and maintaining three street lights on new concrete poles with underground wiring within the territory proposed for annexation, as shown on the diagram, plan, and specifications attached hereto. In addition, the Department of Public Works was ordered to prepare and file an Engineer's Report in accordance with section 22565 et seq. of the California Streets and Highways Code and Article XIII D, Section 4(b) of the California Constitution. This report was prepared in response to that directive.

The First Supervisorial Districts' allocation of Proposition 62 monies will pay the estimated \$45,000 installation cost of the three street lights on concrete poles with underground wiring within Petition No. 6-107. The annual operating cost of \$447 for the three 9,500 lumen high pressure sodium vapor street lights will be funded by CLMD 1687 and CLD LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone). An annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of the street lights of \$5 per parcel for a single-family home, with proportionately higher assessments for other land uses, based on the approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2011-12 Annual Engineer's Report for CLD LLA-1, is proposed to be added to the FY 2012-13 tax bill of property owners whose parcels lie within the boundaries of Petition No. 6-107. Each year thereafter, an annual assessment for the operation and maintenance costs of the street lights approved by the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors will be added to the property tax bill.


With the passage of Proposition 218 (the Right to Vote on Taxes Act) by the California voters in November 1996, the levying of an assessment is now subject to certain provisions under Article XIII D of the California Constitution. This report conforms with the applicable provisions of Proposition 218.

CLMD 1687 is an established Street Lighting District and was fully funded from ad valorem property taxes prior to the passage of Proposition 13 (The People's Initiative to Limit Property Taxation) in 1978, which limited the maximum amount of ad valorem tax on real property. The ad valorem property taxes received under the guidelines established by the State Legislature subsequent to the passage of this amendment are not sufficient to pay the cost of street lighting in the District. Therefore, CLD LLA-1 was formed under the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (section 22585 et seq.) to provide supplemental funding.

The Landscaping and Lighting Act provides for the assessment of street lighting costs against the benefited properties within the lighting district in proportion to the benefits received. A method of distributing the street lighting costs on the basis of land use and land-use data compiled by the County Assessor was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 22, 1979, and amended on July 22, 1997, to include government-owned or -leased parcels. This report showing the approved method and the assessment units to be assessed on the various types of lots and parcels based on land usage is on file in the office of the Board of Supervisors and is made a part hereof by reference. The FY 2011-12 Annual Engineer's Report, which lists the base rate assessment for all zones within CLD LLA-1, and the total assessment amount to be collected from benefited parcels in each zone based on land use, is on file in the office of the Board of supervisors.

The parcel of real property affected is shown in Appendix A, included herein. The parcel is more particularly described in a map prepared in accordance with section 327 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, which is on file in the office of the County Assessor and is made a part hereof by reference.

We believe that it would be in the public interest to install the street lights in the designated territory as requested by the signers of Petition No. 6-107 and to provide for their operation and maintenance.

On December 15, 2009, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors adopted a Resolution Initiating Proceedings for the annexation of territory to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone), pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, for the purpose of providing for the cost of installing, operating, and maintaining two street lights on new wood poles within the territory proposed for annexation and one additional street light on new wood pole within the existing boundaries of CLMD 1687, as shown on the diagram, plan, and specifications attached hereto. In addition, the Department of Public Works was ordered to prepare and file an Engineer's Report in accordance with section 22565 et seq. of the California Streets and Highways Code and Article XIII D, Section 4(b) of the California Constitution. This report was prepared in response to that directive.

There will be no cost for the installation of the three street lights on new wood poles with overhead wiring within Petition No. 23-307. The annual operating cost of \$447 for the three 9500 lumen high pressure sodium vapor street lights will be funded by CLMD 1687 and CLD LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone). An annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of the street lights of \$5 per parcel for a single-family home, with proportionately higher assessments for other land uses, based on the approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2011-12 Annual Engineer's Report for CLD LLA-1, is proposed to be added to the FY 2012-13 tax bill of property owners whose parcels lie within the boundaries of Petition No. 23-307. Each year thereafter, an annual assessment for the operation and maintenance costs of the street lights approved by the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors will be added to the property tax bill.



On December 15, 2009, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors adopted a Resolution Initiating Proceedings for the annexation of territory to County Lighting Maintenance District (CLMD) 1687 and County Lighting District (CLD) LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone), pursuant to the California Streets and Highways Code Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, for the purpose of providing for the cost of installing, operating, and maintaining 14 street lights on concrete poles with overhead wiring within the territory proposed for annexation, as shown on the diagram, plan, and specifications attached hereto. In addition, the Department of Public Works was ordered to prepare and file an Engineer's Report in accordance with section 22565 et seq. of the California Streets and Highways Code and Article XIII D, Section 4(b) of the California Constitution. This report was prepared in response to that directive.

The Puente Hills Community Enhancement and Benefit Fund will finance the estimated \$70,000 cost for the installation of the 14 street lights on concrete poles with overhead wiring within Petition No. 25-307. The annual operating cost of \$2,740 for the one 9,500 lumen and thirteen 22,000 lumen high pressure sodium vapor street lights will be funded by CLMD 1687 and CLD LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone). An annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of the street lights of \$5 per parcel for a single-family home, with proportionately higher assessments for other land uses, based on the approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2011-12 Annual Engineer's Report for CLD LLA-1 is proposed to be added to the FY 2012-13 tax bill of property owners whose parcels lie within the boundaries of Petition No. 25-307. COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO ANNEX TERRITORIES TO COUNTY LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICT 1687, 1697, AND 10006, AND COUNTY LIGHTING DISTRICT LLA-1 (UNINCORPORATED, CARSON AND DIAMOND BAR ZONES), ORDER FORMATION OF IMPROVEMENT ZONE 548 FOR PETITION NO. 107-707, ORDER THE LEVYING OF A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT IN IMPROVEMENT ZONE 548 FOR FISICAL YEAR 2012-13, AND ORDER THE LEVYING OF ASSESSMENTS WITHIN THE ANNEXED TERRITORIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-13

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of the Los Angeles (Board of Supervisors) previously approved and filed Petition Nos. 6-107, 23-307, 25-307, 27-307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, 111-1108, 113-1108, 14-309, 62-608, and 182-1107 requesting annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, 1697, and 10006, and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones), to provide for the installation, operation, and maintenance of street lights within the annexed territories, and assessments for the costs thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors previously approved and filed Petition No. 107-707 requesting the annexation of territory and formation of Improvement Zone 548 in County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone), to finance the installation of costs of the street lighting system on High Pine Street from Muscatel Avenue to the end of the cul-de-sac in the South San Gabriel area.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors on $\underline{9 \cdot 20 \cdot 11}$, has approved the Engineer's Reports for said territories, which contains descriptions of the improvements, estimated installation and operating costs, diagrams of the territories to be annexed, and recommended assessments as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, that:

SECTION 1. The public interest and convenience require and it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors to order the benefited territories hereinafter described, all of which territory lies in the County of Los Angeles, be annexed to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, 1697 and 10006, pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code section 5837.

SECTION 2. The public interest and convenience require and it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors to order, the benefited territories be annexed to County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson and Diamond Bar Zones), pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code section 22605, and that the area within Petition No. 107-707 be formed into Improvement Zone 548, in County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone), pursuant to California Streets and Highways Cods section 22574.

SECTION 3. The public interest and convenience require and it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors to order the expense necessary for the operation, maintenance, repairs, replacement, electric current, care, supervision, and all other items necessary for the proper operation and maintenance of street lighting systems proposed within the annexed territories shall be assessed in Fiscal Year 2012 -13 upon each lot or parcel of land lying within the annexed territories in proportion to the estimated benefit received from the proposed street lighting improvements, and which should be assessed to pay the expenses of the operation and maintenance of said improvements. An annual Engineer's Report approved by your Board each fiscal year, establishes the annual base rate assessment for all zones within County Lighting District LLA-1. For Fiscal Year 2011-12, the annual base rate assessment for the Unincorporated, Carson and Diamond Bar zones are \$5, \$1 and \$13, respectively, for a single-family residence, with proportionately higher assessment rates for other land uses. This annual assessment for the operation and maintenance of street lights is proposed to be added to the property tax bill of benefited parcels within the boundaries of County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones) in Fiscal Year 2012-13. Each year thereafter, an assessment for operation and maintenance costs approved by the Board will be added to the property tax bill.

Formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707 will allow for the financing of the estimated \$30,000 cost for the installation of six street lights on concrete poles with overhead wiring. The loan from County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to Improvement Zone 548 is necessary to provide funding for the installation costs of these street lights. The loan will be repaid to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 through an annual special assessment currently estimated to be \$146 per parcel per year, collected from property owners of the 22 benefited parcels over a 10-year period from Fiscal Year 2012-13 through Fiscal Year 2021-22.

The Engineer's Report prepared for each petitioned territory, contains a full and detailed description of the proposed improvements; a description of the lots or parcels of land to be annexed; the estimated costs of operation and maintenance; a diagram of the territory to be annexed; and the recommended assessment on each lot or parcel of land included therein.

SECTION 4. The boundaries of the territories proposed for annexation and formation of Improvement Zone 548 consists of the areas shown on the attached maps.

SECTION 5. The proposed assessment is subject to majority approval of the property owners. A ballot and public hearing notice will be sent to all property owners within the areas proposed for annexation at least 45 days prior to the date of the public hearing, in the form and manner specified by California Government Code

section 53753. The ballots will be weighted by the amount of assessment to be paid by each property owner. The territory will not be annexed and the proposed assessment will be abandoned if the weighted majority of ballots submitted are opposed to the assessment.


SECTION 6. The amounts to be assessed for the expense of such installation, operation, and maintenance of the work or improvements described above shall be levied and collected in the same manner and by the same officers as taxes for County purposes.



Such publication to be completed at least 10 days prior to the date of said hearing.



WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles (Board of Supervisors) previously approved and filed Petition Nos. 6-107, 23-307, 25-307, 27-307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, 111-1108, 113-1108, 14-309, 62-608, and 182-1107 requesting annexation of territories to County Lighting Maintenance Districts 1687, 1697, and 10006, and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones), to provide for the installation, operation, and maintenance of street lights within the annexed territories and assessments for the costs thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer of the Board of Supervisors did cause the notice of public hearing to be mailed to all property owners within the territory subject to the proposed annexation at least 45 days prior to the date set for hearing; and WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works or her designee has mailed assessment ballots and notices to property owners of identified parcels within the territories proposed for annexation, pursuant to California Government Code section 53753, to indicate support or opposition on the matter of the assessments; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer of the Board of Supervisors did cause the notice of the public hearing to be posted in three conspicuous places within the territories to be annexed, and did give notice of the public hearing by publishing once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation; and

SECTION 1. Petition Nos. 6-107, 23-307, 25-307, 27-307, 28-307, 30-307, 130-907, 111-1108, 113-1108, 14-309, 62-608, 182-1107, and 107-707 for annexation of territories hereinafter described to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, 1697, and 10006, and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated, Carson, and Diamond Bar Zones), and formation of Improvement Zone 548 for Petition No. 107-707, hereinafter described to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 and County Lighting District LLA-1 (Unincorporated Zone) were signed by the property owners representing 60 percent or more of the areas proposed to be annexed.

SECTION 2. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the public interest and convenience require the installation, operation, and maintenance of the street lighting improvements within the territories proposed for annexation and hereby grants the petitions.

SECTION 3. The amounts to be assessed for the expense of the installation, operation, and maintenance of the improvements, as described in said Engineer's Reports and Resolution of Intention, shall be levied and collected in the same manner and by the same officers as taxes for County purposes are levied and collected and shall be disbursed and expended for installation, operation, and maintenance of said improvements, all as described in the Engineer's Reports and in the Resolution of Intention.

SECTION 10. The Executive Officer of the Board is hereby ordered and directed to file a certified copy of the Engineer's Reports, which include lighting district diagrams and assessments together with a certified copy of this resolution upon its adoption, with the County Assessor, Ownership Services Section (Attention Angela Gadsden) and with the Auditor-Controller, Tax Division (Attention Kelvin Aikens).
