Adoption is a life-long commitment and a selfless expression of love and dedication to a child in need of a permanent home. Children in the child welfare system need adults and caregivers that are patient, loving, and willing to provide the nurturing, security and stability that all children desire and need in order to develop their full potential. Adopting a child from the child welfare system has many unique and special benefits that are demonstrated in the everyday actions and words of committed and caring individuals.

Most of the children adopted through the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services have suffered some form of abuse or neglect. These children have had the difficult task of having to leave the place they called home at a moment's notice, and having to adjust to living with new families, in new neighborhoods and surroundings. These experiences would be challenging enough for an adult; now imagine how these experiences affect a child.

The Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services is the largest public child welfare agency in the country. The mission of the Department's Adoption and Permanency Resources Division is to recruit, prepare, and support families to provide healthy, stable, loving and permanent homes to children who cannot safely live with their birth parents.
