Diabetes is a chronic, deadly disease that kills more people each year than breast cancer and AIDS combined. It affects one out of every seven adults (over 1 million people) residing in the County of Los Angeles. Nationally, 25.8 million people live with diabetes, 79 million adults are considered pre-diabetic, and sadly, the rate is increasing. The total health care and related costs for the treatment of diabetes is approximately \$174 billion nationally.

The American Diabetes Association (ADA) is a leader in the fight to stop diabetes, and locally, the ADA partners with community-based groups, schools, hospitals and houses of worship to slow the growth of this deadly disease. In 2011, targeted outreach programs to high-risk populations assisted 76,089 Latinos and 50,643 African Americans in the greater Los Angeles region.
