DPSS serves an ethnically and culturally diverse community through programs that alleviate hardship and promote:

- Health
- Personal Responsibility
- Economic Independence

DPSS MAJOR PROGRAMS

California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs): Temporary cash assistance for families

- Greater Avenues for Independence (GAIN) -Employment Services
- Homeless Housing assistance

CalFresh: Food Benefits

Medi-Cal: Health Benefits

<u>In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS):</u> Personal & domestic services for disable adults to stay in home

General Relief (GR): Temporary cash assistance for adults.

CALWORKS PROGRAM

<u>Federal Name:</u> Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

<u>California Name:</u> California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs)

<u>CalWORKs Services:</u> Families receive money each month to pay:

- > Housing
- Food
- Other necessary expenses.

In August 2013 Los Angeles County provided services to:

- 422,294 individuals
- 174,941 families.

CALWORKS PROGRAM WELFARE-TO-WORK SERVICES

Welfare-to-Work / Greater Avenues for Independence (GAIN)

Provides employment-related services to CalWORKs participants. Services include:

- Education/Training
- Mental health and Substance Use Disorder,
- Domestic Violence
- Intensive case management
- Supportive Services, including child care, transportation, and ancillary expenses
- Subsidized Employment

The Goal of the GAIN program is to assist participants in becoming self-sufficient and gain independence.

CALWORKS HOMELESS SERVICES

DPSS Housing Program offers services to assist CalWORKs families who are homeless, or at risk of homeless. Services offered include:

Homeless Assistance Program: Temporary shelter payments up to 16 consecutive nights.

Moving Assistance Program: Up to \$2000 assistance for moving.

Emergency Assistance to Prevent Eviction Program: Up to \$2000 provided to prevent eviction.

Emergency Shelter and Services: Up to 120 days Emergency Shelter.

Note: Benefits are once in a lifetime and subject to specific requirements.



CALFRESH PROGRAM

Federal Name: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

California Name: CalFresh

CalFresh Services:

- To improve the nutrition of people in low-income households.
- It does that by increasing their food-buying power, so they are able to purchase the amount of food their household needs.

In August 2013 CalFresh Benefits were provided to:

- 1,154,695 Individuals
- 558,617 Households.

Maximum Gross Monthly Income

Funds are accessed through a Golden State Advantage Card, known as **Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card.**

This card is issued when the household's CalFresh case is approved.



MEDI-CAL PROGRAM

Federal Name: Medicaid

California Name: Medi-Cal

Medi-Cal Services: Medical benefits to eligible people

Some groups eligible for Medi-Cal include:

- Children under 21 years of age
- Families (Parents/Guardians with Children)
- Pregnant Women
- Persons in Long Term Care
- Aged 65 & up, Blind & Disabled Individuals



- 1,773,011 Individuals
- 769,893 Households

HEALTH CARE REFORM



Patient Protection & Affordable Care Act (PPACA)

Federal statute that was signed into law on March 23, 2010. Also known as the Affordable Care Act (ACA) or Health Care Reform (HCR).

- Open enrollment began October 1, 2013
- Full HCR Implementation is January 1, 2014
- New Eligibles:
 - An estimated 2.7 million individuals in Los Angeles County are currently uninsured and potentially eligible to health care benefits
 - Under HCR, adults 19-64 that meet new streamlined ACA requirements are now eligible for health coverage.



IN-HOME SUPPORTIVE SERVICES (IHSS) PROGRAM

Federal Name: TITLE XIX (Title Nineteen) under the Medicaid Program

California Name: In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS)

IHSS Services: in home care for aged and disabled.

Who can provide IHSS: Spouse, parent, relative, friend, or a registry provider. Earn an estimate of \$9.00 per hour

Services administered by providers include:

- Domestic Services; Miscellaneous household chores, House Cleaning
- Related Services; Meal Preparation and Clean-up
- Clean up and Laundry
- Personal Care Assistance; Bathing and Personal Grooming, Dressing and Feeding

In August 2013, IHSS services were provided to:

185,259 elderly/disabled individuals

GENERAL RELIEF (GR) PROGRAM

The General Relief Program

Provides cash and supportive services to the neediest adults who do not qualify for state or federal public assistance programs. An average GR case consists of one person, living alone, with no income or resources

- > The maximum monthly grant for one person is \$221 and \$374 for two persons.
- Over 100,000 adults are currently receiving GR Services


GENERAL RELIEF OPPORTUNITIES FOR WORK (GROW)

General Relief Opportunities for Work (GROW)

Mandatory for all <u>employable</u> GR participants. GROW helps GR participants obtain jobs and achieve self-sufficiency.

Services include:

- Orientation and Appraisal
- Job Skills Preparation Class
- Vocational Assessment
- Job Search
- Education and Training
- Supportive Services
- Literacy and General Equivalency Diploma
- Computer Application Class
- And more.....







CUSTOMER SERVICES

- ➤ Outreach Eligibility workers conduct outreach to nontraditional sites, such as health clinics, food pantries, soup kitchens, schools, churches and events.
- ➤ Health & Nutrition Mobile Unit Travels to facilities and events throughout LA County Applicants are interviewed and prescreened for eligibility.
- > Customer Service Center (CSC) Answers questions, provides case information, and updates case records of participants.
- > Your Benefits Now (YBN) website Applicants can apply online and current participants can check their benefits.

Partnership with Community-Based Organizations, Faith-Based Organizations assist potentially eligible households complete applications.



 - Leverages resources to cost-effectively achieve each departments' program goals.
 - Complementary case plans prevent duplication of services.
 - Promotes family well-being and self-sufficiency.
