DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION: APPROVE CAPITAL PROJECTS AND PROJECT BUDGETS FOR CASTAIC SPORTS COMPLEX PLAYGROUND REPLACEMENT AND NEW SHADE STRUCTURE. **CAPITAL PROJECT NO. 87181:** JACKIE ROBINSON PARK NEW SHADE STRUCTURE. **CAPITAL PROJECT NO. 87177:** PEARBLOSSOM PARK NEW SHADE STRUCTURE, **CAPITAL PROJECT NO. 87178:** GEORGE LANE PARK NEW SHADE STRUCTURE. **CAPITAL PROJECT NO. 87179; AND** STEPHEN SORENSEN PARK NEW SHADE STRUCTURE. **CAPITAL PROJECT NO. 87180** ADVERTISE AND AWARD CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FIFTH DISTRICT (3 VOTES)

SUBJECT

Approval of the recommended actions will authorize the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation to implement the proposed Castaic Sports Complex Playground Replacement and New Shade Structure Project; and the proposed Jackie Robinson, Pearblossom, George Lane, and Stephen Sorensen Parks New Shade Structure Projects.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

1. Find that the proposed Castaic Sports Complex Playground Replacement and New Shade Structure Project and the new shade structure Projects for Jackie Robinson, Pearblossom, George

Lane, and Stephen Sorensen Parks are categorically exempt from California Environmental Quality Act according to Section 15303 (e) of the State California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines as the projects involve the installation of new small structures and equipment, and for the reasons stated herein and those reflected in the record of the proposed Projects.

- 2. Approve the Castaic Sports Complex Playground Replacement and New Shade Structure Project, Capital Project No. 87181, with a budget in the amount of \$450,000.
- 3. Approve the Jackie Robinson Park New Shade Structure Project, Capital Project No. 87177, with a budget in the amount of \$125,000.
- 4. Approve the Pearblossom Park New Shade Structure Project, Capital Project No. 87178, with a budget in the amount of \$65,000.
- 5. Approve the George Lane Park New Shade Structure Project, Capital Project No. 87179, with a budget in the amount of \$100,000.
- 6. Approve the Stephen Sorensen Park New Shade Structure Project, Capital Project No. 87180, with a budget in the amount of \$75,000.
- 7. Authorize the Internal Services Department, as the Purchasing Agent for the County, to proceed with the acquisition of materials and installation services to complete the proposed Castaic Sports Complex Playground Replacement and New Shade Structure Project; and the proposed Jackie Robinson, Pearblossom, George Lane, and Stephen Sorensen Parks New Shade Structure Projects.
- 8. Authorize the Department of Parks and Recreation to implement the proposed Castaic Sports Complex Playground Replacement and New Shade Structure Project; and the proposed Jackie Robinson, Pearblossom, George Lane, and Stephen Sorensen Parks New Shade Structure Projects in coordination with the Internal Services Department.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of the recommended actions will find the proposed Castaic Sports Complex Playground Replacement and New Shade Structure (Castaic) Project; and the proposed Jackie Robinson, Pearblossom, George Lane, and Stephen Sorensen Parks New Shade Structure Projects (proposed Projects) exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), approve the proposed Projects, and authorize the Department of Parks and Recreation (Department) to deliver the proposed Projects.

The proposed Projects will replace the existing playground equipment with new prefabricated playground equipment at Castaic Sports Complex and install new prefabricated shade structures over existing play areas, where temperatures rise over 100 degrees in the summer season. Currently, the play areas are exposed to the extreme heat and do not provide shelter at the following park locations:

Castaic Sports Complex, Capital Project (C.P.) No. 87181

The Castaic Sports Complex is located at 31320 Castaic Road, in the City of Castaic. The proposed Castaic Project includes installation of new playground equipment for 5 to 12 year-olds to replace the existing, non-compliant Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) playground equipment; and installation

of a new 50'x27'x31' shade structure. The proposed Castaic Project will also include path of travel to the play area from the parking lot to comply with ADA requirements.

Delegation of the authority to award the construction contract is recommended because implementation of the proposed Castaic Project must be coordinated with another play area project, which is scheduled to be installed by First Five LA in May 2014.

Jackie Robinson Park, C.P. No. 87177

Jackie Robinson Park is located at 8773 East Avenue R, in the City of Littlerock. The proposed Jackie Robinson Project includes installation of a new 75' diameter shade structure over the existing play area.

Pearblossom Park, C.P. No. 87178

Pearblossom Park is located at 33922 North 121st Street, in the City of Pearblossom. The proposed Pearblossom Project includes installation of a new 30'x30' shade structure over the existing play area.

George Lane Park, C.P. No. 87179

George Lane Park is located at 5520 West Avenue L-8, in the City of Quartz Hill. The proposed George Lane Project includes installation of a new 30'x25' and a new 35'x30' shade structure over the existing play areas.

Stephen Sorensen Park, C.P. No. 87180

Stephen Sorensen Park is located at 16801 East Avenue P, in the City of Lake Los Angeles. The proposed Stephen Sorensen Project includes installation of new 30'x20' shade structure over the existing play area.

To achieve economies of scale, the Department recommends delegating authority to the Department to award a contract to a contractor to perform all of the Shade Structure Projects, because procuring the shade structures together will allow for a discount.

Procurement of the play equipment and new shade structures falls within the authority of the Internal Services Department (ISD), the County's Purchasing Agent (Purchasing Agent). However, because of the specialized nature of the installation and the need to meet code requirements, the installation labor costs may exceed ISD's purchasing authority. Therefore, the Board's approval is required for the Purchasing Agent to proceed with the acquisition.

The Department's North Agency staff will manage the proposed Projects.

<u>Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals</u>

The recommendations support the Board-approved County Strategic Plan Goals of Operational Effectiveness (Goal 1) by investing in public infrastructure and amenities to enhance recreational opportunities that benefit County residents.

Green Building/Sustainable Design Program

The proposed Projects will support the Board's Green Building/Sustainable Design Program by incorporating sustainable design features as part of the proposed Projects to the greatest extent possible.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

The individual project costs for installation of playground equipment and new shade structures are listed below. The Project Schedule and Budget Summaries are detailed in Attachment I.

Castaic Sports Complex, C.P. No. 87181

The total Project cost is estimated at \$450,000, and is funded with Utility User Tax Cy Pres II Funds. Sufficient appropriation is available in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013-14 Capital Projects Budget (C.P. No. 87181) to proceed with the proposed Castaic Project.

Jackie Robinson Park, C.P. No. 87177

The total Project cost is estimated at \$125,000, and is funded with Utility User Tax Cy Pres II Funds. Sufficient appropriation is available in the FY 2013-14 Capital Projects Budget (C.P. No. 87177) to proceed with the proposed Project.

Pearblossom Park, C.P. No. 87178

The total Project cost is estimated at \$65,000, and is funded with Utility User Tax Cy Pres II Funds. Sufficient appropriation is available in the FY 2013-14 Capital Projects Budget (C.P. No. 87178) to proceed with the proposed Project.

George Lane Park, C.P. No. 87179

The total Project cost is estimated at \$100,000, and is funded with Utility User Tax Cy Pres II Funds. Sufficient appropriation is available in the FY 2013-14 Capital Projects Budget (C.P. No. 87179) to proceed with the proposed Project.

Stephen Sorensen Park, C.P. No. 87180

The total Project cost is estimated at \$75,000, and is funded with Utility User Tax Cy Pres II Funds. Sufficient appropriation is available in the FY 2013-14 Capital Projects Budget (C.P. No. 87180) to proceed with the proposed Project.

Operating Budget Impact

Based on the proposed Project descriptions, the Department does not anticipate any one-time startup or ongoing costs. The provisions of the proposed Projects have maintenance requirements that will be fulfilled with existing park staff and resources.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The standard Board-directed clauses that provide for contract termination, renegotiation, and hiring

qualified displaced County employees will be included in the contract.

The contractor, who is awarded this contract, will be required to fully comply with Los Angeles County Code Chapter 2.200 (Child Support Compliance Program), Chapter 2.203 (Contractor Employee Jury Service Program).

In accordance with the Board's Civic Art Policy, adopted on December 7, 2004, and revised on December 15, 2009, Civic Art fees do not apply to the proposed Projects, as the proposed Projects individual cost is less than \$500,000.

The proposed Projects are not subject to the Countywide Energy and Environmental Policy adopted by your Board on January 16, 2007, since they involve the installation of prefabricated shade structures and play equipment, each less than 10,000 gross square feet in size.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The proposed Projects are categorically exempt from CEQA. The proposed Projects, which include a new shade structure and new playground equipment at Castaic Sports Complex, and new shade structures at Jackie Robinson, Pearblossom, George Lane, and Stephen Sorensen Parks, are within a class of projects that have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment in that they meet the criteria set forth in Section 15303(e) of the State CEQA Guidelines, and Class 3(b) of the County's Environmental Document Reporting Procedures and Guidelines, Appendix G. The proposed Projects are not located in a sensitive environment, and there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances or other limiting factors that would make the exemption inapplicable based on the project records.

Upon the Board's approval of the proposed Projects, the Department will file Notices of Exemption with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk in accordance with Section 15062 of the State CEQA Guidelines.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The procurement of the playground equipment, shade structures, and installation falls under the statutory authority of the Purchasing Agent and will be competitively solicited in accordance with County Policies and Procedures. However, because of the specialized nature of the installation and the need to meet code requirements, the installation labor costs may exceed ISD's purchasing authority. Therefore, the Board's approval is required for the Purchasing Agent to proceed with the acquisition.

To ensure the contract is awarded to the contractor with a satisfactory history of performance, bidders are required to report violations of the False Claims Act, criminal convictions, civil litigation, defaulted contracts with County, complaints filed with the Contractor State License Board, labor law/payroll violation, and debarment actions. As provided in Board Policy No. 5.140 information reported by the contractor will be considered before making a recommendation to award.

The contract specifications contain provisions requiring the contractor to report solicitations of improper consideration of County employees and allowing the County to terminate the contract if it is found that the contractor offered or gave improper consideration to County employees.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

The proposed Projects' specifications require the contractor to coordinate the installation schedule with the Parks daily activities to minimize disruption to the public.
