#### **SUBJECT**

This letter recommends approval of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Advance Contract Amendments between the County of Los Angeles and the Florence Firestone Chamber of Commerce (FFCC) in the amount of \$25,000 for its Technical Assistance-1st District project; and Volunteers of East Los Angeles (VELA) in the amount of \$30,000 for its Special Events and Programs project.

#### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- 1. Find that Amendment No. 1 to CDBG Advance Contract No. 102353 with FFCC and Amendment No. 1 to CDBG Advance Contract No. 102362 with VELA are not subject to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), as described herein, because the activities are not defined as a project under CEQA.
- 2. Approve and authorize the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute Amendment No. 1 to CDBG Advance Contract No. 102353 with FFCC, presented in substantially final form, to increase the amount by \$25,000, from \$60,000 to \$85,000, for the Technical Assistance-1st District project, following approval as to form by County Counsel and execution by all parties, through June 30, 2015.
- 3. Approve and authorize the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute Amendment No. 1 to

CDBG Advance Contract No. 102362 with VELA, presented in substantially final form, to increase the amount by \$30,000, from \$200,000 to \$230,000, for the Special Events and Programs project, following approval as to form by County Counsel and execution by all parties, through June 30, 2015.

#### PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

FFCC's Technical Assistance-1st District project provides technical assistance to businesses which provide goods and services to the predominantly low- and moderate-income residents of the unincorporated Walnut Park area through workshops, training, and one-on-one consultations. Topics of training will include business development and educating businesses on current market trends. Funds will be used for a consultant to provide technical assistance to an additional 30 businesses. The project is located at 2156 East Florence Avenue in Walnut Park.

VELA's Special Events and Programs project provides assistance and promotion for businesses in the areas of 3rd Street, 1st Street, Cesar E. Chavez Avenue, and adjacent streets affected by the Metro Gold Line as well as the general economy. Funds will be used to produce additional special events in the project area. The project is located at 4743 East Cesar E. Chavez Avenue in unincorporated East Los Angeles.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING**

There is no impact on the County general fund. The proposed CDBG Advance Contract Amendments will be funded with \$55,000 in CDBG funds allocated to the First Supervisorial District. There are sufficient CDBG funds included in the Commission's approved Fiscal Year 2014-2015 budget for the expenses related to the projects.

#### FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

On May 27, 2014, your Board approved the 2014-2015 One-Year Action Plan (Action Plan) for the Fortieth Program Year (July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015) to receive CDBG funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Action Plan contains the County's One-Year Plan to carry out housing and community development activities funded by the CDBG program. The proposed CDBG Advance Contract Amendments are consistent with the purposes set forth in the Action Plan.

Should FFCC or VELA require additional or replacement personnel after the effective date of their CDBG Advance Contract Amendments, they shall give consideration for any such employment openings to participants in the County's Department of Public Social Services' Greater Avenues for Independence (GAIN) Program or General Relief Opportunity for Work (GROW) Program who meet the agency's minimum qualifications for the positions in question.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION**

These projects are exempt from the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act pursuant to 24 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 58, Section 58.34 (a)(4) because they involve public service activities that will not have a physical impact on or result in any physical changes to the environment. These activities are not subject to the provisions of CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines 15060(c)(3) and 15378 because they are not defined as a project under CEQA and do not have the

potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

#### **IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)**

The projects meet the HUD national objective of serving low- and moderate-income persons.

#### **Activity Summary**

This is a continuing program for which Volunteers of East Los Angeles (VELA) is the designated Community-Based Development Organization (CBDO). This program is aimed at stimulating businesses within the unincorporated area of the First Supervisorial District, a predominately lowand moderate-income area through the following activities:

(1) Providing professional technical support, website maintenance, advertising, signage, marketing, events, and promotions to indicate that the businesses along the 3rd Street corridor are

(2) Fund local artists to place three (3) new or refurbished murals at three (3) different business locations, where the walls have been defaced with gang graffiti. The murals will display the rich history of East Los Angeles and the refurbishing will revitalize the neighborhoods.

This project is 100% CDBG-funded.

Of the total budget \$60,000 in CDBG funds will be used to pay for personnel and non-personnel costs associated with the mural project. The remaining \$170,000 in CDBG funds will be used to pay for personnel and non-personnel costs associated with the coordination of supporting the businesses located along the corridors of 3rd Street, 1st Street, and E. Cesar E. Chavez; including adjacent streets.

#### **Special Conditions**

Per 36 CFR 800: Protection of Historic Properties (Section 106 Historic Review): should any water and or sandblasting equipment be used for graffiti removal on residential or commercial properties, the Operating Agency shall submit a Basic Property Identification Form for these properties to the Community Development Commission (CDC) for review. Review and clearance of proposed actions through this process must be granted PRIOR to the start of graffiti removal on the property when "destructive removal methods" are used (sand or water blasting). Historic properties that may be adversely impacted will be evaluated by the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO). Floodplain review and public noticing in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 must also be completed where applicable. Each property must be cleared through this office on an INDIVIDUAL basis.

The Operating Agency must maintain payroll and time attendance records signed by the employee and approved by the supervisor. Time distribution records must reflect total work time on a daily basis by program and/or funding source, as applicable.

The Operating Agency will comply with procurement standards outlined in, 24 CFR, Part 84, Section 84.44, entitled Procurement Procedures, for the purchase of all goods and contracted services using CDBG or ESG funds.
