A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA,
CALLING FOR THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL
ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2015,
FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED
BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF
CALIFORNIA RELATING TO GENERAL LAW CITIES AND
FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS A QUESTION
RELATING TO THE EXTENSION AND INCREASE
IN THE LIBRARY SPECIAL TAX

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the laws relating to General Law Cities in the State of California, a City of South Pasadena (City) General Municipal Election shall be held on November 3, 2015, for the election of Municipal Officers; and

WHEREAS, the City Council also desires to submit to the voters at the election a question relating to the extension and increase in the Library Special Tax; and

**WHEREAS**, a special tax to support the City of South Pasadena Public Library (Library) was first approved in 1994, and has been renewed by the City's voters three times since then; and

**WHEREAS**, unless it is renewed again by the voters, the Library Special Tax will expire on June 30, 2016, and a major funding source dedicated to the Library's maintenance, operating, and administrative costs will disappear; and

WHEREAS, the Library Special Tax has remained constant since it was first approved in 1994, and it thus has not kept pace with inflation (approximately 61%) that has accrued over more than two decades; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to seek the voters' approval to (1) extend the Library Special Tax for eight years to June 30, 2024; and (2) allow the Library Special Tax to increase to account for approximately 33.3% of the inflation that has accrued since 1994 and that will accrue in the future; and

WHEREAS, the revisions to the Library Special Tax proposed by the City Council are limited to an eight-year extension and an increase to address inflation, and all other restrictions on this tax in the South Pasadena Municipal Code will remain in effect; all current exemptions to this tax will remain in place; revenue collected through the tax will continue to be used only to pay Library maintenance and operation costs; the tax must be decreased if the City Council does not also support Library costs with sufficient revenue from the City's General Fund; and any surplus Library tax revenue left over from

the previous fiscal year must be considered when the City levies this Library Special Tax in the current fiscal year.

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to General Law Cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of South Pasadena, California, on Tuesday, November 3, 2015, a General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing three (3) members of the City Council for the full term of four years.

**SECTION 2.** That the City Council, pursuant to its right and authority, does order submitted to the voters of the General Municipal Election the following question:

To keep the South Pasadena Public Library open every day and to help update its technology, shall an ordinance be adopted extending the Library Special Tax for 8 years; setting the rate for homeowners at \$32-\$64/year depending on residential square footage; for non-residential property owners at \$32-\$128/year based on lot size and for multi-family property owners at \$16/unit; and adding an annual Los Angeles Consumer Price Index adjustment?

**SECTION 3.** That the proposed complete text of the measure (Ordinance) submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit "A."

**SECTION 4**. That the vote requirement for the measure to pass is 2/3 (.666%) of the votes cast. Only the qualified electors of the City of South Pasadena are entitled to vote on the Library Special Tax (Measure).

**SECTION 5.** That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

**SECTION 6.** The Chief Deputy City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to coordinate with the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

**SECTION 7.** That the polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Elections Code Section 10242, except as provided in Section 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

**SECTION 8.** That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the General Municipal Election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

**SECTION 9.** That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the Chief Deputy City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

**SECTION 10.** That in the event of a tie vote (if any two or more persons receive an equal and the highest number of votes for an office) as certified by the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk, the City Council, in accordance with Elections Code Section 15651(a), shall set a date and time and place and summon the candidates who have received the tie votes to appear and will determine the tie by lot.

**SECTION 11.** That the City Council authorizes the Chief Deputy City Clerk to administer said election, as conducted by the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk, and all reasonable and actual election expenses shall be paid by the City upon presentation of a properly submitted bill.

**SECTION 12.** That the City Clerk of the City of South Pasadena shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and its approval by the City Council and shall cause the same to be listed in the records of the City.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE PEOPLE
OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA,

**NOW THEREFORE**, The People of the City of South Pasadena ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1. Extension of Library Special Tax.** Section 2.89-6 of the South Pasadena Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

#### 2.89-6 Term.

The library special tax provided for herein may be levied annually until June 30, 2024. Such levy may only be extended with the approval of two-thirds of the electors of the city voting upon the extension at a municipal election.

**SECTION 2. Increase in Library Special Tax**. Subdivision (a) of Section 2.89-5 of the South Pasadena Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

# 2.89-5 Tax rate; contingency

- (a) An annual special tax is levied on the categories of property in the jurisdiction of the city as shown in that certain Report of the Rate and Method of Apportionment, prepared by BSI Consultants, Inc., dated February 9, 1994, attached as Exhibit 1 to Ordinance No. 2025 and incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth.
  - (1) In Fiscal Year 2016–2017, the maximum rates for the special tax imposed by this article shall be those noted in Table A below:

**SECTION 3. Authority to Impose Tax**. Section 2.89-3 of the South Pasadena Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

# 2.89-3 Special Tax

- (a) There is imposed a special tax on each residential dwelling unit or nonresidential parcel within the city of South Pasadena for the purposes set forth in this article at the rate specified herein.
- (b) This tax is enacted under the authority of Article XIIIA, Section 4 of the California Constitution.

SECTION 4. Savings Clause. If any section, subsection, part, clause, sentence or phrase of this ordinance or the application thereof is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance, the application thereof and the tax imposed shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect, it being the intent of the People to adopt each and every section, subsection, part, clause, or phrase regardless of whether any other section, subsection, part, clause, or phrase or the application thereof is held to be invalid or unconstitutional.

**SECTION 5**. This ordinance shall take effect the date the results of the November 3, 2015 General Municipal Election are certified, no more than 30 days following the election, but only if the ordinance receives approval from at least two-thirds of the qualified electors voting on the ballot measure regarding this ordinance.

TO BE HELD ON THE DATE PURSUANT TO
SECTION 10403 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of South Pasadena called a General Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2015, for the purpose of the election of three Members of the City Council; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is submitting to the voters the question relating to the extension and increase in the Library Special Tax; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the General Municipal Election be consolidated with the School Election to be held on the same date and that within the city the precincts, polling places and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the County Election Department of the County of Los Angeles canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election and that the General Municipal Election be held in all respects as if there were only one election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** That pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of a General Municipal Election with the School election on Tuesday, November 3, 2015, for the purpose of the election of three Members of the City Council for terms that end in November 2019.

**SECTION 2.** That a Measure is to appear on the ballot as follows:

- **SECTION 3.** That the proposed complete text of the Measure (Ordinance) submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit "A."

- **SECTION 5.** That the County Election Department is authorized to canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.
- **SECTION 6.** That the County Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Election Department to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.
- **SECTION 7.** That the City of South Pasadena recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for any costs.
- **SECTION 8.** That the Chief Deputy City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the County Election Department of the County of Los Angeles.
- **SECTION 9.** The City Clerk of the City of South Pasadena shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and its approval by the City Council and shall cause the same to be listed in the records of the City.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA,
ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR
ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO CANDIDATES'
STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT A
GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD
ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2015

WHEREAS, Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of any local agency adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of the candidate's statement.

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

### **SECTION 1.** GENERAL PROVISIONS.

That pursuant to Section 13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an Election to be held in the City of South Pasadena on November 3, 2015, may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the Chief Deputy City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate himself or herself. The statement shall not include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten form in the Office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.

### **SECTION 2.** FOREIGN LANGUAGE POLICY.

- A. Pursuant to the Federal Voting Rights Act, candidates' statements will be translated into all languages required by the County of Los Angeles (County). The County is required to translate candidates' statements into the following nine languages for the translated sample ballot booklet: Spanish, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Tagalog, Vietnamese, Thai, Hindi, and Khmer.
- B. The County will print and mail sample ballots in English to all registered voters. If the candidate submits a candidate's statement for the sample ballot, the County can include a Spanish translation of the statement—if the candidate requests this and agrees to pay for the printing. Otherwise, Spanish-

language sample ballots, which include all candidates' statements, will be sent to those on the County voter file as having requested a sample ballot in Spanish (required for the City of South Pasadena). The County will also make such sample ballots available through its website and its multilingual hotline.

- C. The County will mail separate sample ballots, which include candidates' statements, in Chinese and Korean to those voters who are on the County voter file as having requested a sample ballot in Chinese or Korean (required for the City of South Pasadena). The County will also make such sample ballots available through its website and its multilingual hotline.
- D. The County will make the sample ballot available in the remainder of the languages required by law, i.e., Japanese, Tagalog, Vietnamese, Thai, Hindi, and Khmer, which are not required in South Pasadena, through its website.
- E. The County will make the sample ballots, which include all candidates' statements, available at all polling places in Spanish, Chinese, and Korean. Language assistance in nine required languages is available at the polling places from the County of Los Angeles through the multilingual hotline.

#### **SECTION 3. PAYMENT.**

### A. Translations:

1. The candidate shall not be required to pay for the cost of translating the candidate's statement into any <u>required</u> foreign language as specified in Section 2 above pursuant to Federal and\or State law.

## B. Printing:

- 1. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in English in the main voter pamphlet.
- 2. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in Spanish in the main voter pamphlet.
- 3. The candidate shall not be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a required language in the translated sample ballot (not in the main voter pamphlet mailed to all voters).

The Chief Deputy City Clerk shall obtain an estimate from the County of the total cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the candidates' statements filed pursuant to this section, including costs incurred as a result of complying with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (as amended), and require each candidate filing a statement to pay in advance to the local agency his or her estimated pro rata share as a condition of having his or her statement included in the voter's pamphlet. In the event the estimated payment is required, the estimate is just an approximation of the actual cost that varies from one election to another election and may be significantly more or less than the estimate, depending on the actual number of candidates filing statements. Accordingly, the Chief Deputy City Clerk is not bound by the estimate and may, on a pro rata basis, bill the candidate for additional actual expense or refund any excess paid depending on the final

actual cost. In the event of underpayment, the Chief Deputy City Clerk may require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the Chief Deputy City Clerk shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount paid within 30 days of the election.

## **SECTION 4.** MISCELLANEOUS.

- A. Candidates' statements will be translated by translators qualified by the County.
- B. The County will determine various formatting styles permitted in the candidates' statements, e.g., bold type, capitalization, bullets.
- C. The Chief Deputy City Clerk shall comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections as determined by the County.

#### **SECTION 5.** ADDITIONAL MATERIALS.

No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the sample ballot package.

- **SECTION 6.** That the Chief Deputy City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative a copy of this resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.
- **SECTION 7.** That all previous resolutions establishing City Council policy on payment for candidates' statements shall then be repealed.
- **SECTION 8.** That this resolution shall apply only to the General Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2015, and shall then be repealed.
- **SECTION 9.** The City Clerk of the City of South Pasadena shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and its approval by the City Council and shall cause the same to be listed in the records of the City.
