ACCEPT 2015 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM GRANT FUNDS AND APPROVE APPROPRIATION ADJUSTMENT

(ALL AFFECTED DISTRICTS)

(4-VOTES)

SUBJECT

Board approval is requested to accept the County of Los Angeles' (County) allocation of the 2015 State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) grant funds and approve an Appropriation Adjustment to make the funds available to the appropriate County departments. The SHSP grant enhances the capacity of State and local agencies to respond to incidents of terrorism, particularly those involving chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive incidents, as well as natural disasters. The enhancements are provided through coordinated training, exercises, equipment acquisition, and technical assistance.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

- 1. Find that the County activities to be funded with the 2015 State Homeland Security Program Grant Funds from the Department of Homeland Security do not constitute projects under the California Environmental Quality Act because they are continuing administrative or organizational activities of government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment or are categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act for the reasons stated in this letter and in the record of the exempt projects;
- 2. Accept \$10,302,291 in grant funds from the 2015 State Homeland Security Program grant as distributed through the California Office of Emergency Services;

- 3. Approve an Appropriation Adjustment in the amount of \$15,188,000 which will distribute funding to the following impacted departments: Emergency Preparedness and Response (\$10,303,000), Fire (\$862,000), Health Services Administration [Emergency Medical Services] (\$446,000), Medical Examiner Coroner (\$355,000), Public Works (\$25,000), and the Sheriff (\$3,197,000);
- 4. Adopt the attached Governing Body Resolution which authorizes the Chief Executive Officer, or her designee, to apply for and execute State Homeland Security Program grant awards and all future amendments, modifications, extensions, and augmentations as necessary;
- 5. Delegate authority to the Chief Executive Officer, or her designee, to enter into subrecipient agreements with cities providing for use and re-allocation of these funds; and to execute all future amendments, modifications, extensions and augmentations relative to the subrecipient agreements, as necessary; and
- 6. Authorize the County's Purchasing Agent to proceed with the solicitation and purchase of capital asset items in excess of \$250,000.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has released grant funding through the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) to enhance the capacity of State and local agencies to respond to incidents of terrorism, particularly those involving chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive incidents, as well as natural disasters. The enhancements are provided through coordinated training, exercises, equipment acquisition, and technical assistance.

The Board of Supervisors (Board) has authorized the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to administer this SHSP grant on behalf of the Los Angeles County Operational Area. The Board is requested to approve the attached Governing Body Resolution (Attachment A) which provides a list of CEO personnel authorized to sign grant documents for the SHSP grants. The CEO will also be authorized to submit to Cal OES other grant documents including, but not limited to, grant assurances and reimbursement requests.

We are further requesting the CEO be granted delegated authority to enter into subrecipient agreements with the various cities receiving SHSP grant funds. Following the signing of agreements, these funds will be distributed to the cities, agencies and County departments approved by DHS and Cal OES on a cost reimbursement basis. These agreements will be in a form approved by County Counsel.

<u>Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals</u>

The recommended actions support Goal 1, Operational Effectiveness/Fiscal Sustainability, of the County's Strategic Plan.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

This SHSP grant is fully funded by the DHS through Cal OES. There is no matching fund requirement or impact on net County cost. Of the \$10,302,291 grant, \$4,722,268 will be retained by the County for various programs under the grant, including 5 percent identified for management and

administration costs, and \$5,580,023 will be allocated to local jurisdictions for approved projects/programs. The attached Appropriation Adjustment (Attachment B) will distribute funding to the following impacted departments: Emergency Preparedness and Response (\$10,303,000), Fire (\$862,000), Health Services - Administration [Emergency Medical Services] (\$446,000), Medical Examiner - Coroner (\$355,000), Public Works (\$25,000), and the Sheriff (\$3,197,000).

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Cal OES has provided the Los Angeles County Operational Area with specific guidelines for the management and administration of this grant. These guidelines detail the activities and expenditures that are allowable under the grant.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

The majority of the activities to be funded as identified in Attachment C as well as the funds to be disbursed to the cities do not constitute a project pursuant to CEQA because they involve equipment purchases, training costs and other expenses excluded from the definition of a project by Section 15378(b) of the State CEQA Guidelines on the basis that they are organizational or administrative activities of government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. The remainder of the activities involve installation of small new equipment at existing facilities or ongoing leasing activities which involve negligible or no expansion of an existing use and are therefore categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15301(a) and (f) and 15303(e) of the State CEQA Guidelines and Classes 1(d) and (i) and 3(b) and (j) of the County's Environmental Documentation and Reporting Procedures and Guidelines, Appendix G. The exempt activities are not located in a sensitive environment and there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances or other limiting factors that make the exemption inapplicable based on the project records. Each subrecipient is required to comply with CEQA, as applicable, in order to be reimbursed with grant funds. CEO staff will continue to assist the lead federal granting agency, as necessary, to complete its requirements under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

CONTRACTING PROCESS

The acquisition of equipment (Attachment C) is under the statutory authority of the County's Purchasing Agent and will be requisitioned, solicited, and purchased in accordance with County Purchasing Policies and Procedures.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

This SHSP grant provides funding to the County for planning, equipment, training, exercises, and program management and administration for emergency prevention, preparedness, and response personnel. The grant will have a positive impact on current services by improving and enhancing the County's ability to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from potential terrorist attacks and other hazards.
