# PRESENTATION ON 2-1-1 LA COUNTY - MARY SANDERS, COMMUNITY LIASION

Mary Sanders, Community Liaison, gave a brief overview of the 2-1-1- LA County Information Line. The 211 provides an easy-to-use, caring, professional source of guidance, advocacy, and 24/7 access to a comprehensive range of human services for the people of Los Angeles County.

The 211 information line is a private, not-for-profit organization formerly known as "INFO LINE" of Los Angeles. It is the largest information and referral service in the nation, helping 450,000 individuals and families in Los Angeles County each year. Professional community resource advisors help callers with critical issues like health care and substance abuse, domestic violence, shelters, food, legal and financial assistance, children and senior programs and mental health services.

Since 1981, 211 information line has provided free, confidential services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Services are provided in English, Spanish, and over 140 other languages via a tele-interpreting service.

In addition, services are also provided for the hearing impaired. President Duba thanked Mary Sanders for her informative presentation.
