## MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL AREA (MHPSA) SHORTAGE DESIGNATION UPDATE

With the assistance of Rachel Gannon, Dr. Southard's MSW intern, WET has streamlined the MHPSA application process and developed training tools to assist Providers in applying for the designation.

The streamlined application process is a result of compiling information required for the process in a user-friendly GIS mapping tool to locate providers and their respective MSSAs (the geographic boundary used by the Feds in the designation process) and an automated way to gather caseload information from reports developed by CIOB. Training tools include a manual and use of WebEx to provide individual support and consultation to agencies.

In February, after presenting at the District Chief's meeting on the 9<sup>th</sup>, WET will disseminate instructions through the District Chiefs so Programs can begin the application process for their area.

One difficulty will be ensuring coordination and collaboration between all applicants to prevent a duplication of effort.

#### Status:

SA 1 – Only one of the three areas in Service Area 1 can be designated because of the way that Federal Government looks at the breakdown of provider to population ratios.

WET is pursuing Designation for the one area (77.1a) that qualifies. The programs in that area are:

We will appeal to the Feds for designation of the other two areas due to the geographic spread of SA 1. The areas in which the programs are located are heavily populated with Psychiatrists, but they serve clients for the entire service area and not just the immediate Palmdale / Lancaster city centers where the Federal boundaries lay.

Other Areas - Workers from AFH and Specialized Foster Care have had difficulty in getting responses for the MD Survey. We hope that this will be addressed by working with the District Chiefs and disseminating information to Providers in February.




