Healthy Kids Update

The Healthy Kids Program offers low-cost health coverage for children of different age groups whose families don't qualify for Medi-Cal but meet other eligibility and income requirements.

Starting March 1, 2013, the Healthy Kids program will no longer provide benefits for current members ages 6-18. Members age 0-5 will not see any disruption of benefits. The program will remain open to new members between 0 and 5.

CaliforniaKids

CaliforniaKids (CalKids) provides preventive, behavioral health, and primary health care benefits to children ages 2-18, however, inpatient/hospitalization services are not covered. CalKids is currently open and accepting new applications.

There is no income limit and immigration status does not matter. Monthly premiums are \$75 per child and co-payments range from \$5 to \$110, depending on the services. For more information or for an application form, go to www.californiakids.org.
