On Thursday, February 6, 2014, the Joyful Heart Foundation hosted *A Day of Wellness* for 140 clinicians at Descanso Gardens in La Cañada Flintridge. The conference was provided at no cost to the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health's (LACDMH) Service Area 2 children's programs and providers. It addressed the effects of trauma on the workforce.
