



### Program Goals

- Family focused center that provides services to children and families who require minimal support and resources to maintain stability
- Transition to independence, empowerment and resiliency based
- To serve those in need of ongoing support, but not ongoing services to maintain gains
- Provide services to children coming out of foster care
- Provide information and resources to families in the community who do not yet have any system involvement (e.g. mental health, DCFS, Probation)

- Licensed and licensed eligible clinicians
- Psychiatrist and/or nurse practitioner
- Substance abuse counselor
- Public health nurse
- Vocational specialist

#### Services

- Clinical Assessment
- Client and family driven treatment planning
- As needed medication support
- Perinatal/infant health
- Child and respite care
- Suicide prevention
- Linkage to resources
- Gang prevention
- Healthy living/nutrition/cooking classes
- Support groups (parents/caregivers and youth)
- Substance abuse services
- Employment assistance

#### Recommendations

- Open during evening hours
- Accessible to anyone/everyone in the community
- Create a system where data can be shared based on one consent
- Incorporate protective factors as care components of the program

#### **Outcomes**

- Improved access to services
- Enhanced community partnerships and supportive services
- Reduced stigma associated with mental health
- Improved family functioning
- Improved grades/school performance/attendance
- Reduce recidivism
- Increased parent educational levels
- Proposed Outcome Tool: Youth Outcome Questionnaire (YOQ)
