El Parque Nuestro Opens New Park in "Park Poor" Community

Supervisor Gloria Molina and Director Russ Guiney were joined by local parents and more than 100 elementary school students on June 16, 2010 to dedicate El Parque Nuestro, a new, Green, fitness park in one of the County's "park-poor" communities.

El Parque Nuestro offers passive recreation and outdoor fitness. The new Green park is the first in the County's park system to use recycled materi-



als for benches and tables. It also uses smart controller irrigation system, solar lighting and features porous concrete jogging paths. The park is also equipped with drought tolerant plants, play equipment, BBQ pits and fitness equipment.

"El Parque Nuestro" means our park in Spanish and the name has a story behind it. Children from Lillian Elementary School were invited to enter a contest and submit a brief paragraph of what they thought the name should be. The name had to reflect the

spirit and uniqueness of the new park and represent the community's diversity. Eightyear-old Natalie Torres received a commendation from Supervisor Molina for naming the park and approximately 100 of her classmates were present to celebrate with her. Natalie wanted the park to be "everybody's park" and "a place for all of her friends to have fun."



A Special Tribute to a Beloved Employee

This year would have been the year that marked Keith Garrison's twenty years as a permanent employee with the Department of Parks and Recreation. Sadly, after a long fight with Lou Gehrig's disease, Keith passed away on February 24, 2010.

During his years of service in recreation, Keith positively impacted the lives of community members, especially youth, through effective recreational program-

ming. He enriched the lives of both Parks staff and park patrons with his friendly and positive attitude. Keith was a one-of-a-kind person who was able to connect with people from all walks of life and make them feel comfortable.

In 2003, Keith made a successful transition from the field to the administrative office to work as a Grant Writer. In 2005, he was part of the grant-writing team that brought in over \$17.5 million in grants—an unprecedented amount—for capital improvements to our parks. The \$17.5 million also substantially offset the County budget for capital project needs, which otherwise would have required alternative funding sources.

Keith received numerous accolades for his work performance and excellent programs throughout his County career. Most recently, in 2006, Keith was the Department's Permanent Employee of the Year and he went on to be the County Employee of the Year.

Keith was dedicated and proud to work for Parks and Recreation. He always presented a professional image to the public and the Department. His dedication and pride was clearly evident through his excellent job performance and reliability. Keith's contributions and efforts have substantially impacted the lives of our constituents and our communities.

At the spring Section Head and Above meeting, Director Russ Guiney presented Keith Garrison's 20-year award to his girlfriend Eva Kwon, in honor of Keith's 20 dedicated years to Los Angeles County.

Lake Lifeguards Take on the Baker to Vegas Public Safety Desert Relay Race!

The Los Angeles County Lake Lifeguards have provided more than 75 years of public service for the Department's three most popular lakes: Castaic Lake; Puddingstone Lake and Santa Fe Dam. County Lifeguards patrol over 40 miles of Southern California waters and while keeping swim beaches safe, enforcing water safety and boating laws, they still find time to come together as a team to participate in the sportsmanship of relay racing. The Los Angeles County Lake Lifeguards participated in the Baker to Vegas Public Safety Desert Relay Race, which was held on Saturday, April 19 through Sunday, April 20 and lasted 14 hours. The team placed ninth overall and third in their division in a field of 256 teams.

The Lifeguard team, supported solely by volunteers, was comprised of 20 runners and 10 support staff, made up of personnel from all three lake facilities. The team's final running time was 14 hours and 42 minutes and 42 seconds! Weather didn't deter the team, even with the day-time temperatures being the hottest since 1992, and reaching 104 degrees Fahrenheit by 1:30

p.m. that day! This is the only event that brings together all three lakes as a team to compete with other agencies. The team's fastest runner was Roger Castaneda, who averaged 6 minutes, 28 seconds per mile, on the steepest portion of the race!

Congratulations to all of the Department's Lake Lifeguards on a job well done. And thank you volunteers for supporting the team! We hope to see you compete again next year!
