Alexander H. Rogers served as county supervisor for two terms. He was elected in 1878, beginning his term the following year, and again in 1880, serving until 1883.

Rogers was born in Philadelphia, Pa., where he grew up and attended public schools.

In 1849 he became one of first of the so-called "forty-niners" who moved to the San Francisco area that year in search of gold. He spent the next 21 years in Northern California making his fortune.

In 1870 Rogers moved to Los Angeles and began farming. His business sense and civic mindedness led to his election to the county supervisorial seat.

On June 4, 1906, Rogers died. He was survived by his wife, Nancy.
