Oscar Hauge served as county supervisor for two terms. On Dec. 1, 1938, he was appointed to his first term when Leland M. Ford resigned after being elected to Congress.

Born Sept. 17, 1868 on a Minnesota farm, he entered politics early, first holding office at age 21 as township assessor in Faribault County. Later he went to school in Chicago and graduated with a degree in dentistry. He moved to Miles City, Mont., and served as chairman of the Republican Central Committee.

In 1913 Hauge moved to Long Beach and participated in civic affairs. For several years he was a member of the State Department of Finance. Hauge served as county supervisor for the Fourth District from 1938 – 1944.

On June 23, 1945, Hauge died of a heart attack. He was 76, and was survived by three daughters and a son.
